## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the establishment of the Rural Infrastructure Disaster

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter D-1 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER D-1. RURAL INFRASTRUCTURE DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM
8	Sec. 418.081. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Account" means the rural infrastructure disaster
10	recovery account created under Section 418.086.
11	(2) "Critical infrastructure" includes:
12	(A) a road;
13	(B) a public school;
14	(C) a hospital or other health care facility;
15	(D) a water intake structure, water treatment
16	facility, wastewater treatment plant, or pump station;
17	(E) utility-scale water or wastewater storage,
18	treatment, or transmission facilities; and
19	(F) airport facilities used for the landing,
20	parking, refueling, shelter, or takeoff of aircraft, maintenance or
21	servicing of aircraft, aircraft equipment storage, or navigation of
22	aircraft.
23	(3) "Disaster area" means an area in this state

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declared to be a disaster area by the governor.

1	(4) "Eligible political subdivision" means a
2	political subdivision that meets the qualifications prescribed by
3	Section 418.083.
4	(5) "Political subdivision," notwithstanding Section
5	418.004, means a county, municipality, special district, school
6	district, junior college district, or other political subdivision
7	of this state.
8	Sec. 418.082. RURAL INFRASTRUCTURE DISASTER RECOVERY
9	PROGRAM. (a) The division shall establish and administer a rural
10	infrastructure disaster recovery program in accordance with this
11	subchapter to benefit eligible political subdivisions. The program
12	must be designed to provide financial assistance in the form of
13	grants to rural communities located in a disaster area for the
14	purpose of rebuilding and repairing critical infrastructure
15	damaged by a disaster.
16	(b) The division may make grants in accordance with this
17	subchapter using money appropriated to the division for the
18	purposes of this subchapter.
19	Sec. 418.083. ELIGIBILITY FOR GRANT. A political
20	subdivision is eligible to apply to the division for a grant under
21	this subchapter if the political subdivision is:
22	(1) a county:
23	(A) that:
24	(i) has a population of less than 100,000;
25	(ii) has a gross domestic product of less
26	than \$2 billion;
27	(iii) has a poverty rate greater than 15

1 percent; and 2 (iv) is located wholly or partly in a 3 disaster area; and 4 (B) for which the total dollar amount of damages 5 resulting from the disaster, as shown in an assessment of damages prepared after the disaster, exceeds the amount equal to 10 percent 6 7 of the state and local sales and use taxes collected in the county during the state fiscal year preceding the year in which the 8 disaster occurs; or 10 (2) a political subdivision other than a county that is wholly or partly located in a county described by Subdivision 11 (1). 12 Sec. 418.084. GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The division may make a 13 grant to an eligible political subdivision using money in the 14 15 account to assist in the rebuilding or repair of critical infrastructure located in the eligible political subdivision that 16 17 is damaged by a disaster that may reasonably be considered a public calamity. 18 19 (b) The proceeds of a grant made by the division using money in the account may not be used by the eligible political subdivision 20 receiving the grant for any purpose other than the purpose 21 22 described by Subsection (a). - 10 ACCOUNT. (a) The rural infrastructure disaster recovery account
- 11 is established as an account in the general revenue fund with the
- 12 comptroller, to be administered by the division.
- 13 (b) The division may use the rural infrastructure disaster
- 14 recovery account only for:
- 15 (1) making a grant to an eligible political
- 16 <u>subdivision; and</u>
- 17 (2) paying the necessary and reasonable expenses of
- 18 administering the grant.
- 19 (c) The account consists of:
- (1) money appropriated, credited, or transferred to
- 21 the account by the legislature;
- (2) gifts or grants contributed to the account; and
- 23 (3) interest earned on deposits and investments of the
- 24 account.
- Sec. 418.087. RULES. The division shall adopt rules
- 26 necessary to administer this subchapter, including rules
- 27 establishing procedures for the application for and award of

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- 1 grants, distribution of grants, and administration of grants and
- 2 the grant program established under this subchapter.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
