- 6 SECTION 1. Section 38.211, Education Code, is amended by

- 9 (b-1) The commissioner of state health services or, if the
- 10 commissioner is not a physician, the chief medical executive of the
- 11 Department of State Health Services shall issue statewide standing
- 12 orders prescribing epinephrine auto-injectors and medication for
- 13 <u>respiratory distress to a school district, open-enrollment charter</u>
- 14 school, or private school.
- 15 (c) The standing order under Subsection (b) or (b-1) is not
- 16 required to be patient-specific, and the epinephrine auto-injector
- 17 or medication for respiratory distress may be administered to a
- 18 person without a previously established physician-patient
- 19 relationship.
- SECTION 2. Section 38.225, Education Code, is amended by
- 21 adding Subsection (b-1) and amending Subsection (c) to read as

- 1 Department of State Health Services shall issue a statewide
- 2 standing order prescribing opioid antagonists to a school district,

- 4 (c) The standing order under Subsection (b) or (b-1) is not
- 5 required to be patient-specific, and the opioid antagonist may be
- 6 administered to a person without a previously established
- 7 physician-patient relationship.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
