H.B. No. 3025

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to requiring parental consent for the use of corporal

- 3 punishment in public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 37.0011, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection (e) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b) If the board of trustees of an independent school
- 9 district adopts a policy under Section 37.001(a)(8) under which
- 10 corporal punishment is permitted as a method of student discipline,
- 11 a district educator may use corporal punishment to discipline a
- 12 student only if [unless] the student's parent or guardian or other
- 13 person having lawful control over the student has previously
- 14 provided [a] written, signed consent to [statement prohibiting] the
- 15 use of corporal punishment as a method of student discipline.
- 16 (c) To <u>provide consent for</u> [prohibit] the use of corporal
- 17 punishment as a method of student discipline, [each school year] a
- 18 student's parent or guardian or other person having lawful control
- 19 over the student must provide $[\frac{1}{4}]$ separate written, signed consent
- 20 [statement] to the board of trustees of the school district in the
- 21 manner established by the board. Subject to Subsection (e),
- 22 consent under this subsection is effective until:
- 23 (1) consent is revoked under Subsection (d); or
- 24 (2) the student is no longer enrolled in the district.

- 1 (d) The student's parent or guardian or other person having
- 2 lawful control over the student may revoke the consent [statement]
- 3 provided to the board of trustees under Subsection (c) at any time
- 4 during the school year by submitting a written, signed revocation
- 5 to the board in the manner established by the board.
- 6 (e) The board of trustees of a school district may adopt
- 7 rules requiring a student's parent or guardian or other person
- 8 having lawful control over the student to renew the consent under
- 9 Subsection (c) each school year.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 11 school year.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
