A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to a certificate of public convenience and necessity to 1-21 1-22 1-23 construct an electric transmission line.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 37.052(c), Utilities Code, is amended to 1-25 read as follows:

(c) An electric utility is not required to amend the utility's certificate of public convenience and necessity to construct a transmission line that connects the utility's existing 1-26 1-27 1-28 transmission facilities to a substation or metering point if: 1-29 1-30 (1)

the transmission line does not exceed:

(A) <u>five</u> [three] miles in length, if the line connects to a load-serving substation or metering point; or 1-31 1-32

1-33 (B) two miles in length, if the line connects to a generation substation or metering point; 1-34

1-35 (2) each landowner whose property would be directly 1-36 affected by the transmission line, as provided by commission rules, 1-37 provides written consent for the transmission line; and

(3) all rights-of-way necessary for construction of 1-38 1-39 the transmission line have been purchased.

1-40 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
