## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of accelerated and supplemental
3	instruction for public school students and outcomes-based

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 28.0211, Education Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsections (a-15) and (a-16) to read as follows:
8	(a-15) The agency shall approve high impact tutoring
9	providers for purposes of providing accelerated or supplemental
10	instruction under this section. In approving a provider, the
11	agency shall consider:
12	(1) whether the provider provides personalized
13	instruction to each student;
14	(2) the frequency and consistency of the provider's
15	<pre>instruction;</pre>
16	(3) whether the provider employs qualified and
17	well-trained tutors;
18	(4) whether the provider provides instruction to
19	students individually or in groups of no more than four students per
20	tutor; and
21	(5) whether the provider uses data-driven and
22	research-based best practices.

(a-16) In contracting with a high impact tutoring provider

- 1 shall use an outcomes-based contract. The agency shall develop and
- 2 post on the agency's Internet website a template that districts may
- 3 use in contracting with a provider under this subsection. The
- 4 template must:
- 5 (1) provide for a significant portion of the
- 6 provider's payment to be contingent on the achievement of specific,
- 7 measurable student outcomes;
- 8 (2) allow the district to prioritize certain student
- 9 outcomes;
- 10 (3) align the incentives for the district and the
- 11 provider;
- 12 (4) minimize financial risk for the district;
- 13 (5) ensure that the provider is held accountable for
- 14 delivering the specific, measurable student outcomes outlined in
- 15 the contract; and
- 16 (6) establish a framework for shared accountability
- 17 between the district and the provider.
- SECTION 2. Section 28.0211(a-16), Education Code, as added
- 19 by this Act, applies only to a contract entered into on or after the
- 20 effective date of this Act.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
