7	amended by adding Section 551.0761 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 551.0761. DELIBERATION REGARDING CRITICAL
9	INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY; CLOSED MEETING. (a) In this section:
10	(1) "Critical infrastructure facility" means a
11	communication infrastructure system, cybersecurity system,
12	electric grid, electrical power generating facility, substation,
13	switching station, electrical control center, dam, natural gas and
14	natural gas liquids gathering, processing, and storage
15	transmission and distribution system, hazardous waste treatment
16	system, water treatment facility, water intake structure,
17	wastewater treatment plant, pump station, or water pipeline and
18	related support facility, equipment, and property.
19	(2) "Cybersecurity" means the measures taken to
20	protect a computer, a computer network, a computer system, or other
21	technology infrastructure against unauthorized use or access.
22	(b) This chapter does not require a governmental body to
23	conduct an open meeting to deliberate a cybersecurity measure,
24	policy, or contract solely intended to protect a critical

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1 such information would facilitate unauthorized access to: 2 (A) data or information, whether physical or 3 virtual; or 4 (B) information technology resources, including 5 a governmental body's existing or proposed information technology 6 system. 7 (c) A governmental body may disclose information made 8 confidential by this section to comply with applicable state or federal law or a court order. A governmental body that is required 9 10 to disclose information described by Subsection (b) shall: (1) not later than the fifth business day before the 11 12 date the information is required to be disclosed, provide notice of the required disclosure to the person or third party who owns the 13 critical infrastructure facility or, in the event immediate 14 15 disclosure is required, notify in writing the person or third party as soon as practicable but not later than the fifth business day 16 after the information is disclosed; and 17 (2) retain all existing labeling on the information 18 19 being disclosed describing such information as confidential or 20 privileged. 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 23 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025. 25
