1	AN ACT
2	relating to carbon monoxide detectors in certain properties.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 770 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 770. CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS IN CERTAIN PROPERTIES
7	Sec. 770.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Carbon monoxide detector" means a device designed
9	to detect the presence of a harmful level of carbon monoxide gas and
10	sound a warning alarm.
11	(2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
12	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
13	Sec. 770.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
14	the following properties for which construction begins on or after
15	September 1, 2025:
16	(1) residential real property as defined by Section
17	22.001, Business & Commerce Code;
18	(2) a multiunit residential property as defined by
19	Section 125.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code;
20	(3) a residential facility as defined by Section
21	51.9362, Education Code;
22	(4) a commercial lodging establishment as defined by
23	Section 660.002, Government Code;
24	(5) a fraternity or sorority house as defined by

- 1 <u>Section 766.0025; and</u>
- 2 (6) any other residential property prescribed by
- 3 <u>executive commissioner rule.</u>
- 4 Sec. 770.003. REQUIRED INSTALLATION OF CARBON MONOXIDE
- 5 DETECTOR. (a) The owner of a property described by Section 770.002
- 6 shall ensure the property is equipped with a carbon monoxide
- 7 detector in accordance with rules adopted under this chapter.
- 8 (b) The owner of a property described by Section 770.002 may
- 9 not sell, lease, or otherwise transfer ownership of the property
- 10 unless the property is equipped with a carbon monoxide detector in
- 11 accordance with this chapter and rules adopted under this chapter.
- 12 Sec. 770.004. RULES. The executive commissioner shall
- 13 adopt the rules necessary to implement this chapter, including
- 14 rules prescribing for each type of property described by Section
- 15 770.002 the required placement, installation, and number of carbon
- 16 monoxide detectors and the maintenance procedures for the
- 17 <u>detectors.</u>
- SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 19 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 20 Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement
- 21 Chapter 770, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 23 to a property described by Section 770.002, Health and Safety Code,
- 24 as added by this Act, for which construction begins on or after the
- 25 effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
