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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authority of certain municipalities to receive certain tax revenue derived from a hotel and convention center 3 project and to pledge certain tax revenue for the payment of 4 5 obligations related to the project. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 351.152, Tax Code, is amended to read as 7 8 follows: 9 Sec. 351.152. APPLICABILITY.
