1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of real estate appraisers and appraisal
3	management companies.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 1103, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1103.164 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1103.164. STIPEND PROGRAM. (a) The board shall
8	establish a program to provide stipends to appraiser trainees and
9	certified appraisers who serve as supervisory appraisers for the
10	following public purposes:
11	(1) promoting the professional needs of this state;
12	(2) increasing the number of highly trained and
13	educated appraisers available to serve the residents of this state;
14	and
15	(3) improving the business environment of and
16	encouraging economic development in this state.
17	(b) In awarding stipends under this section, the board shall
18	consider the financial need of each person who applies for a stipend
19	under this section.
20	(c) The board may use only gifts, grants, and donations
21	received under Section 1103.157 to fund the stipend program under
22	this section.
23	(d) The board shall adopt rules necessary to implement this
24	section, including rules establishing the amount of a stipend

1 awarded under this section.

2 SECTION 2. Section 1103.203(d), Occupations Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

(d) The application must include the applicant's current
mailing address, business address, and business telephone number
and the applicant's business e-mail address, if available. The
applicant shall notify the board of any change in the applicant's
mailing or e-mail address or telephone number while the application
is pending.

10 SECTION 3. Section 1104.104(b), Occupations Code, is 11 amended to read as follows:

12 (b) The controlling person designated under Subsection (a):13 (1) must:

14 (A) be <u>licensed or</u> certified as an appraiser in
15 at least one state at all times during the designation; or

16 (B) have completed:

17 (i) the 15-hour national Uniform Standards18 of Professional Appraisal Practice course; and

(ii) the seven-hour national Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice update course not more than two years before the renewal of the appraisal management company's registration;

(2) may not have had a license or certificate to act as
an appraiser denied, revoked, or surrendered in lieu of revocation
in any state unless:

(A) the person has subsequently had the license
 or certificate to act as an appraiser granted or reinstated; and

(B) the license or certificate to act as an
 appraiser was denied, revoked, or surrendered for a nonsubstantive
 reason as determined by the board; and

4 (3) shall submit to a background investigation, as5 determined by the board.

6 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 1104.151, Occupations 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 1104.151. <u>RESTRICTIONS ON</u> EMPLOYMENT <u>AND CONTROLLING</u> 9 PERSON [OF CERTAIN PERSONS PROHIBITED].

10 SECTION 5. Section 1104.151(a), Occupations Code, is 11 amended to read as follows:

12 (a) An appraisal management company registered under this13 chapter may not knowingly:

(1) employ a person in a position in which the person has the responsibility to order appraisals or to review completed appraisals if the person has had a license or certificate to act as an appraiser denied, revoked, or surrendered in lieu of revocation in any state;

19 (2) enter into any independent contractor arrangement 20 for the provision of appraisals or appraisal management services 21 with any person who has had a license or certificate to act as an 22 appraiser denied, revoked, or surrendered in lieu of revocation in 23 any state; [or]

(3) enter into any contract, agreement, or other
business relationship for the provision of appraisals or appraisal
management services with any entity that employs, has entered into
an independent contract arrangement, or has entered into any

1 contract, agreement, or other business relationship with any person
2 who has ever had a license or certificate to act as an appraiser
3 denied, revoked, or surrendered in lieu of revocation in any state;
4 or

5 (4) have, as a controlling person, a person who has had 6 a license or certificate as an appraiser or a registration as an 7 appraisal management company suspended, revoked, or put on 8 probation in any state.

9 SECTION 6. Section 1104.202(d), Occupations Code, is 10 amended to read as follows:

Notwithstanding any other law, the board shall remit an 11 (d) 12 administrative penalty collected under this section to the comptroller for deposit in the general revenue fund 13 [an administrative penalty collected under this section must be 14 15 deposited in a restricted fund maintained and operated by the board to develop educational programs for appraisers or to conduct 16 17 studies that enhance consumer protection].

SECTION 7. Sections 1104.205(b) and (c), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

(b) An investigator designated by the presiding officer of the board or <u>the executive director</u> [commissioner] shall investigate each allegation in a complaint to determine whether probable cause exists for a hearing on the complaint.

(c) If the board determines that a complaint does not present facts that are grounds for disciplinary action, the board or the <u>executive director</u> [commissioner] shall dismiss the complaint and may not take further action.

SECTION 8. Section 1104.208(b), Occupations Code, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 (b) The board by rule may delegate any of its authority
4 under Subsection (a) to the <u>executive director</u> [commissioner].

5 SECTION 9. Section 1104.2081(b), Occupations Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (b) An agreed order must be:

8

(1) approved by the board; and

9 (2) signed by the <u>executive director</u> [commissioner] 10 and the appraisal management company or other person who is the 11 subject of the complaint.

SECTION 10. Section 1103.203, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an application for a certificate or license or renewal of a certificate or license submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An application submitted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

19 SECTION 11. Section 1104.151(a), Occupations Code, as 20 amended by this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after 21 the effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the 22 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the 23 date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect 24 for that purpose.

25 SECTION 12. Section 1104.202(d), Occupations Code, as 26 amended by this Act, applies only to an administrative penalty that 27 is collected on or after the effective date of this Act. An

administrative penalty collected before the effective date of this
Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the penalty was
collected, and the former law is continued in effect for that
purpose.

5 SECTION 13. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 6 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

7 (b) Section 1103.164, Occupations Code, as added by this 8 Act, takes effect immediately if this Act receives a vote of 9 two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by 10 Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not 11 receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, that section takes 12 effect September 1, 2025.
