5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 83A to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 83A. RITA LITTLEFIELD CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE CENTRALIZED
9	RESOURCE CENTER
10	Sec. 83A.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "resource
11	center" means the Rita Littlefield Chronic Kidney Disease
12	Centralized Resource Center established under this chapter.
13	Sec. 83A.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF RESOURCE CENTER. The Rita
14	Littlefield Chronic Kidney Disease Centralized Resource Center is
15	established within the commission to serve as a centralized system
16	through which persons may:
17	(1) obtain information on:
18	(A) chronic kidney disease and related
19	illnesses, including each clinical stage of kidney disease and end
20	stage renal disease; and
21	(2) receive information on clinical trials and
22	clinical trial opportunities for chronic kidney disease and related
23	<u>illnesses.</u>
24	Sec. 83A.003. ADMINISTRATION OF RESOURCE CENTER. (a) The

- commission shall administer the resource center in accordance with
 this chapter.

 (b) The commission shall:

 (1) structure and operate the resource center in a
- (1) structure and operate the resource center in a

 manner that provides a comprehensive approach for readily accessing

 information on and resources for chronic kidney disease and related

 illnesses, including for each clinical stage of kidney disease and

 end stage renal disease; and
- 9 (2) establish, and the resource center shall maintain,
 10 a kidney health clinical trials registry through which patients and
 11 family members of those patients may register to receive
 12 educational information on clinical trials and clinical trial
 13 opportunities based on the clinical stage of a patient's chronic
 14 kidney disease or end stage renal disease.
- (c) The comprehensive approach described by Subsection (b)(1) must allow individuals to obtain or to directly access aggregated information on:
- 18 <u>(1) chronic kidney disease awareness, prevention, and</u>
 19 professional education opportunities, including:
- 20 <u>(A) awareness campaigns for chronic kidney</u>
 21 disease and related illnesses;
- 22 (B) information on accessing free screenings for chronic kidney disease and related illnesses;
- (C) professional resources and continuing

 education opportunities for health care providers who treat

 patients with chronic kidney disease or related illnesses;
- 27 (D) for individuals who register for inclusion in

- 1 the kidney health clinical trials registry established under
- 2 Subsection (b)(2), information on clinical trials and clinical
- 3 trial opportunities for chronic kidney disease and related
- 4 illnesses; and
- 5 (E) information on chronic kidney disease
- 6 partners, including chronic kidney disease patient advocates,
- 7 dialysis professionals, health care providers, researchers,
- 8 manufacturers, and other appropriate persons;
- 9 (2) patient and family resources, including:
- 10 (A) educational resources containing general and
- 11 specific chronic kidney disease information;
- 12 (B) resources containing information on chronic
- 13 kidney disease prevention and early detection of chronic kidney
- 14 disease and related illnesses;
- 15 (C) nutritional and metabolism information for
- 16 individuals with chronic kidney disease and related illnesses; and
- 17 (D) directories for physicians who specialize in
- 18 kidney health;
- 19 (3) resources on chronic kidney disease treatment
- 20 options and modalities, including:
- 21 (A) kidney donations and kidney transplantation
- 22 initiatives;
- 23 (B) <u>deceased and living organ donation programs</u>
- 24 and initiatives;
- 25 (C) organ recipient registries;
- 26 (D) treatment options for chronic kidney disease
- 27 and end stage renal disease;

- 1 (E) financial assistance for obtaining treatment
- 2 for chronic kidney disease or related illnesses.
- 3 (d) The commission shall ensure information provided by the
- 4 resource center is available in both English and Spanish.
- 5 Sec. 83A.004. INTERNET WEBSITE. In collaboration with the
- 6 Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force established under Chapter 83, the
- 7 commission shall add and maintain information and resources of the
- 8 resource center on the commission's Internet website.
- 9 Sec. 83A.005. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The commission
- 10 may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source
- 11 to implement this chapter.
- 12 SECTION 2. The Health and Human Services Commission is
- 13 required to implement a provision of this Act only if the
- 14 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If
- 15 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that
- 16 purpose, the commission may, but is not required to, implement a
- 17 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that
- 18 purpose.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
