- 2 relating to the mission of governing boards of public institutions
- 3 of higher education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 51.352, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and renumbering
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (a) It is the policy of this state that the governing boards
- 9 of institutions of higher education, being composed of lay members,
- 10 shall exercise the traditional and time-honored role for such
- 11 boards as their role has evolved in the United States and shall
- 12 constitute the keystone of the governance structure. In this
- 13 regard each governing board:
- 14 (1) is expected to preserve institutional
- 15 independence and to defend its right to manage its own affairs
- 16 through its chosen administrators and employees;
- 17 (2) shall enhance the public image of each institution
- 18 under its governance;
- 19 (3) shall interpret the community to the campus and
- 20 interpret the campus to the community;
- 21 (4) shall nurture each institution under its
- 22 governance to the end that each institution achieves its full
- 23 potential within its role and mission to ensure each and every
- 24 student has an equal, meaningful opportunity to succeed in their

- 1 <u>academic and professional development;</u> and
- 2 (5) shall insist on clarity of focus and mission of
- 3 each institution under its governance.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 51.3525, Education Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 6 (b) The governing board of an institution of higher
- 7 education shall ensure that each unit of the institution:
- 8 (1) does not, except as required by federal law and for
- 9 the purposes of fulfilling the governing board's mission under
- 10 section 51.352(a)(4):
- 11 (A) establish or maintain a diversity, equity,
- 12 and inclusion office;
- 13 (B) hire or assign an employee of the institution
- 14 or contract with a third party to perform the duties of a diversity,
- 15 equity, and inclusion office;
- 16 (C) compel, require, induce, or solicit any
- 17 person to provide a diversity, equity, and inclusion statement or
- 18 give preferential consideration to any person based on the
- 19 provision of a diversity, equity, and inclusion statement;
- 20 (D) give preference on the basis of race, sex,
- 21 color, ethnicity, or national origin to an applicant for
- 22 employment, an employee, or a participant in any function of the
- 23 institution; or
- 24 (E) require as a condition of enrolling at the
- 25 institution or performing any institution function any person to
- 26 participate in diversity, equity, and inclusion training, which:
- 27 (i) includes a training, program, or

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- 1 activity designed or implemented in reference to race, color,
- 2 ethnicity, gender identity, or sexual orientation; and
- 4 or activity developed by an attorney and approved in writing by the
- 5 institution's general counsel and the Texas Higher Education
- 6 Coordinating Board for the sole purpose of ensuring compliance with
- 7 any applicable court order or state or federal law; and
- 8 (2) adopts policies and procedures for appropriately
- 9 disciplining, including by termination, an employee or contractor
- 10 of the institution who engages in conduct in violation of
- 11 Subdivision (1).
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
