1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Texas Commission on Marriage and 3 Family. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "commission" means the 5 Texas Commission on Marriage and Family. 6 SECTION 2. FINDINGS. The legislature finds that: 7 (1) it is in the best interests of this state to 8 promote lasting marriage and the practice of raising children in 9 stable, two-parent households; 10 (2) Texas must promote evidence-based pathways to 11 12 support strong and healthy family connections by reducing barriers that prevent Texans from marrying and raising children; 13 14 (3) certain state laws, rules, and policies may discourage the positive and desirable ends of marriage and family 15 formation; and 16 17 (4) it is necessary to convene a commission to: 18 (A) study and develop strategies to promote strong marriages and healthy families; and 19 identify state laws, rules, and policies that 20 (B) 21 discourage Texans from marrying and raising children. 22 SECTION 3. PURPOSE. The commission is created to study and 23 develop strategies for promoting strong marriages and healthy families and to make recommendations to the legislature to advance 24

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the goal of creating an environment in this state that is favorable
 for marriage and raising children.

3 SECTION 4. COMPOSITION. (a) The commission is composed of 4 seven members as follows:

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three members appointed by the governor;

6 (2) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor;7 and

8 (3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house9 of representatives.

10 (b) In making the appointments under Subsection (a) of this 11 section, an appointing authority shall ensure the commission is 12 composed of members with a background and demonstrated expertise in 13 marriage and family formation, including:

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an attorney who is board certified in family law;

(2) child and family counselors;

(3) child development experts;

17 (4) community-based nonprofit organization leaders18 who work to promote healthy marriages and parenting;

19 (5) published researchers in the subjects of marriage,
20 parenting, and the benefits of strong and stable families in
21 society; and

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(6) members of the clergy.

(c) The governor shall appoint one member of the commissionto serve as the commission's presiding officer.

25 SECTION 5. MEETINGS. (a) The commission shall meet at the 26 call of the commission's presiding officer.

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(b)

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A meeting conducted under this section may be held in

1 person, by telephone, or by other means of communication.

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(c) All commission meetings shall be open to the public.

3 (d) A member of the commission serves without compensation
4 but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses
5 incurred in performing official duties.

6 SECTION 6. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. The Health and Human 7 Services Commission shall provide administrative support services 8 at the request of the commission, including the provision of 9 meeting space and assistance in drafting and compiling the report 10 required by this Act.

11 SECTION 7. DUTIES OF COMMISSION. The commission shall:

(1) evaluate existing state laws, rules, and policies
and identify those that discourage Texans from marrying and raising
children;

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(2) assess the effectiveness of:

16 (A) state-funded premarital education programs17 and other initiatives promoting marriage; and

(B) state-funded programs in encouraging family
 formation and helping parents develop and apply successful
 parenting skills and techniques; and

21 (3) make recommendations to the legislature 22 regarding:

(A) necessary changes to state laws, rules, and
 policies that are identified as being detrimental to the promotion
 of lasting marriages, family formation, and child rearing; and
 (B) policies, programs, and strategies to:
 (i) support and increase the formation of

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strong, lasting marriages and healthy family connections; and
 (ii) reduce the incidence of divorce and
 family dissolution.

4 SECTION 8. APPOINTMENT. Not later than the 60th day after 5 the effective date of this Act, the appropriate appointing 6 authority shall appoint the members of the commission as required 7 by this Act.

8 SECTION 9. REPORT. Not later than November 1, 2026, the 9 commission shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, 10 the speaker of the house of representatives, and each member of the 11 legislature a written report that includes a summary of the 12 commission's findings and any legislative recommendations.

13 SECTION 10. EXPIRATION. The commission is abolished and 14 this Act expires December 31, 2026.

15 SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 16 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 17 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 18 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 19 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
