H.B. No. 3284

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the creation of the Texas Commission on Marriage and
- 3 Family.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "commission" means the
- 6 Texas Commission on Marriage and Family.
- 7 SECTION 2. FINDINGS. The legislature finds that:
- 8 (1) it is in the best interests of this state to
- 9 promote lasting marriage and the practice of raising children in
- 10 stable, two-parent households;
- 11 (2) Texas must promote evidence-based pathways to
- 12 support strong and healthy family connections by reducing barriers
- 13 that prevent Texans from marrying and raising children;
- 14 (3) certain state laws, rules, and policies may
- 15 discourage the positive and desirable ends of marriage and family
- 16 formation; and
- 17 (4) it is necessary to convene a commission to:
- 18 (A) study and develop strategies to promote
- 19 strong marriages and healthy families; and
- 20 (B) identify state laws, rules, and policies that
- 21 discourage Texans from marrying and raising children.
- 22 SECTION 3. PURPOSE. The commission is created to study and
- 23 develop strategies for promoting strong marriages and healthy
- 24 families and to make recommendations to the legislature to advance

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- 1 the goal of creating an environment in this state that is favorable
- 2 for marriage and raising children.
- 3 SECTION 4. COMPOSITION. (a) The commission is composed of
- 4 seven members as follows:
- 5 (1) three members appointed by the governor;
- 6 (2) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 7 and
- 8 (3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house
- 9 of representatives.
- 10 (b) In making the appointments under Subsection (a) of this
- 11 section, an appointing authority shall ensure the commission is
- 12 composed of members with a background and demonstrated expertise in
- 13 marriage and family formation, including:
- 14 (1) child and family counselors;
- 15 (2) child development experts;
- 16 (3) community-based nonprofit organization leaders
- 17 who work to promote healthy marriages and parenting;
- 18 (4) published researchers in the subjects of marriage,
- 19 parenting, and the benefits of strong and stable families in
- 20 society; and
- 21 (5) members of the clergy.
- (c) The governor shall appoint one member of the commission
- 23 to serve as the commission's presiding officer.
- SECTION 5. MEETINGS. (a) The commission shall meet at the
- 25 call of the commission's presiding officer.
- 26 (b) A meeting conducted under this section may be held in
- 27 person, by telephone, or by other means of communication.

- 1 (c) All commission meetings shall be open to the public.
- 2 (d) A member of the commission serves without compensation
- 3 but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses
- 4 incurred in performing official duties.
- 5 SECTION 6. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. The Health and Human
- 6 Services Commission shall provide administrative support services
- 7 at the request of the commission, including the provision of
- 8 meeting space and assistance in drafting and compiling the report
- 9 required by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 7. DUTIES OF COMMISSION. The commission shall:
- 11 (1) evaluate existing state laws, rules, and policies
- 12 and identify those that discourage Texans from marrying and raising
- 13 children;
- 14 (2) assess the effectiveness of:
- 15 (A) state-funded premarital education programs
- 16 and other initiatives promoting marriage; and
- 17 (B) state-funded programs in encouraging family
- 18 formation and helping parents develop and apply successful
- 19 parenting skills and techniques; and
- 20 (3) make recommendations to the legislature
- 21 regarding:
- (A) necessary changes to state laws, rules, and
- 23 policies that are identified as being detrimental to the promotion
- 24 of lasting marriages, family formation, and child rearing; and
- 25 (B) policies, programs, and strategies to:
- 26 (i) support and increase the formation of
- 27 strong, lasting marriages and healthy family connections; and

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- 1 (ii) reduce the incidence of divorce and
- 2 family dissolution.
- 3 SECTION 8. APPOINTMENT. Not later than the 60th day after
- 4 the effective date of this Act, the appropriate appointing
- 5 authority shall appoint the members of the commission as required
- 6 by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 9. REPORT. Not later than November 1, 2026, the
- 8 commission shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor,
- 9 the speaker of the house of representatives, and each member of the
- 10 legislature a written report that includes a summary of the
- 11 commission's findings and any legislative recommendations.
- 12 SECTION 10. EXPIRATION. The commission is abolished and
- 13 this Act expires December 31, 2026.
- 14 SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 15 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 16 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 17 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 18 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
