2 relating to the use of automated traffic control systems by local

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 542.2035, Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 542.2035. LIMITATION ON LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND LAW
- 8 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES [MUNICIPALITIES]. (a) Except as provided by
- 9 Subsection (b), a local authority or law enforcement agency [A
- 10 municipality may not implement or operate an automated traffic
- 11 control system with respect to a highway or street under its
- 12 jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing compliance with traffic
- 13 <u>laws</u> [posted speed limits]. The attorney general shall enforce
- 14 this subsection.
- 15 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), and subject to
- 16 Subsection (c), a local authority or law enforcement agency may
- 17 implement or operate an automated traffic control system with
- 18 respect to a highway or street under its jurisdiction for the
- 19 purpose of enforcing compliance with traffic laws, including posted
- 20 speed limits, in a construction or maintenance work zone. A local
- 21 authority or law enforcement agency that implements or operates an
- 22 automated traffic control system under this subsection shall adopt
- 23 policies requiring the prompt deletion of data produced by that
- 24 system that is not related to an active criminal or civil

- 1 <u>investigation or proceeding.</u>
- 2 (c) A local authority or law enforcement agency may issue a
- 3 citation for a violation of a traffic law detected using an
- 4 automated traffic control system under Subsection (b) only if:
- 5 (1) the citation is issued by a peace officer at the
- 6 time of the violation; and
- 7 (2) signs that comply with the requirements of
- 8 Subsection (d) are posted at the time of the violation.
- 9 (d) A local authority or law enforcement agency that
- 10 implements or operates an automated traffic control system for the
- 11 purpose of enforcing traffic laws in a construction or maintenance
- 12 work zone under Subsection (b) shall post clear and conspicuous
- 13 signs at least 100 feet from the beginning of the construction or
- 14 maintenance work zone that:
- 15 <u>(1) indicate an automated traffic control system is</u>
- 16 actively being used to monitor motor vehicles in the construction
- 17 or maintenance work zone; and
- 18 (2) conform to the manual and specifications adopted
- 19 under Section 544.001.
- 20 (e) In this section: $[\tau]$
- 21 <u>(1)</u> "<u>Automated</u> [<u>automated</u>] traffic control system"
- 22 means a photographic device, radar device, laser device, or other
- 23 electrical or mechanical device designed to:
- (A) $\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$ record the speed of a motor vehicle;

- (B) $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ obtain one or more photographs or other
- 27 recorded images of:

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- 1 $\underline{\text{(i)}} [\frac{\text{(A)}}{\text{(i)}}]$ the vehicle;
- 2 (ii) $[\frac{B}{B}]$ the license plate attached to
- 3 the vehicle; or
- 4 (iii) $[\frac{C}{C}]$ the operator of the vehicle.
- 5 (2) "Construction or maintenance work zone" has the
- 6 meaning assigned by Section 472.022.
- 7 (3) "Law enforcement agency" has the meaning assigned
- 8 by Article 2B.0053, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 9 (4) "Traffic law" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 10 702.001.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 707, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 12 adding Section 707.022 to read as follows:
- Sec. 707.022. CONSTRUCTION OR MAINTENANCE WORK ZONE
- 14 EXCEPTION. This chapter does not apply to an automated traffic
- 15 control system, as defined by Section 542.2035, that is authorized
- 16 by Section 542.2035(b).
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
