- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 754.011, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subdivision (21-a) to read as follows:
- 7 (21-a) "Semiannual inspection" means an inspection of
- 8 equipment performed twice in a 12-month period in accordance with
- 9 the applicable ASME Code A17.1, ASME Code A17.3, ASME Code A18.1, or
- 10 ASCE Code 21. The term includes an acceptance inspection performed
- 11 within that period.

- SECTION 2. Sections 754.015(a) and (c), Health and Safety
- 13 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The commission by rule shall provide for:
- 15 (1) <u>a semiannual</u> [an annual] inspection and
- 16 certification of the equipment covered by standards adopted under
- 17 this chapter;
- 18 (2) enforcement of those standards;
- 19 (3) registration, including certification, of
- 20 elevator inspectors;
- 21 (4) registration of contractors;
- 22 (5) the procedures by which a certificate of
- 23 compliance is issued and displayed;
- 24 (6) notification to building owners, architects, and

- 1 other building industry professionals regarding the necessity of
- 2 semiannually [annually] inspecting equipment;
- 3 (7) approval of continuing education programs for
- 4 registered elevator inspectors;
- 5 (8) standards of conduct for individuals who are
- 6 registered under this chapter;
- 7 (9) general liability insurance written by an insurer
- 8 authorized to engage in the business of insurance in this state or
- 9 an eligible surplus lines insurer, as defined by Section 981.002,
- 10 Insurance Code, as a condition of contractor registration with
- 11 coverage of not less than:
- 12 (A) \$1 million for each single occurrence of
- 13 bodily injury or death; and
- 14 (B) \$500,000 for each single occurrence of
- 15 property damage;
- 16 (10) the submission and review of plans for the
- 17 installation or alteration of equipment;
- 18 (11) continuing education requirements for renewal of
- 19 contractor registration;
- 20 (12) maintenance control programs, maintenance,
- 21 repair, and parts manuals, and product-specific inspection,
- 22 testing, and maintenance procedures;
- 23 (13) the method and manner of reporting accidents and
- 24 reportable conditions to the department; and
- 25 (14) an owner's designation of an agent for purposes of
- 26 this chapter.
- 27 (c) The commission by rule may require a reinspection or

- 1 recertification of equipment if:
- 2 (1) the equipment has been altered;
- 3 (2) the equipment poses a significant threat to
- 4 passenger or worker safety; or
- 5 (3) a semiannual [an annual] inspection report
- 6 indicates an existing violation has continued longer than permitted
- 7 in a delay granted by the executive director.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 754.019(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) The owner shall:
- 11 (1) have the equipment inspected semiannually
- 12 [annually] by a registered elevator inspector, unless the equipment
- 13 has been removed from service in accordance with commission rules;
- 14 (2) obtain an inspection report from the inspector
- 15 evidencing that all equipment in a building on the real property was
- 16 inspected in accordance with this chapter and rules adopted under
- 17 this chapter;
- 18 (3) file with the executive director each inspection
- 19 report, and all applicable fees, not later than the 30th calendar
- 20 day after the date on which an inspection is made under this
- 21 chapter;
- 22 (4) display the certificate of compliance for the
- 23 equipment in a publicly visible area as defined by commission rule;
- 24 and
- 25 (5) maintain the equipment in compliance with the
- 26 standards and codes adopted under commission rules.
- 27 SECTION 4. Section 754.0235(a), Health and Safety Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) An emergency order issued in accordance with Section
- 3 754.0234 may also direct an owner to disconnect power to or lock out
- 4 equipment if:
- 5 (1) the department determines imminent and
- 6 significant danger to passenger or worker safety exists if action
- 7 is not taken immediately; or
- 8 (2) <u>a semiannual</u> [an annual] inspection has not been
- 9 performed in more than two years.
- SECTION 5. Section 754.011(4), Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 repealed.
- 12 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
