1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation and licensing of reroofing contractors by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation; providing 3 administrative and civil penalties; authorizing fees. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Title 8, Occupations Code, is amended by adding 7 Chapter 1306 to read as follows: CHAPTER 1306. REROOFING CONTRACTORS 8 9 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS Sec. 1306.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 10 (1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission 11 of 12 Licensing and Regulation. 13 (2) "Department" means the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation. 14 15 (3) "Executive director" means the executive director 16 of the department. (4) "Licensed reroofing contractor" means a reroofing 17 contractor who holds a license issued under this chapter. 18 (5) "Person" means an individual or business entity. 19 "Reroofing contractor" means a person who: 20 (6) 21 (A) engages in repairing, recovering, or replacing existing roof coverings on residential or commercial 22 23 structures; or 24 (B) solicits, advertises, or contracts to

(7) "Reroofing project" means a project to repair, 3 recover, or replace an existing roof covering on a residential or 4 5 commercial structure. 6 SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES 7 Sec. 1306.051. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The department 8 shall administer and enforce this chapter. 9 Sec. 1306.052. RULES. The commission by rule shall prescribe the requirements for the issuance and renewal of a 10 11 license under this chapter. Sec. 1306.053. FEES. The commission shall establish by 12 rule and collect reasonable and necessary fees in amounts not to 13 14 exceed the total amount sufficient to cover the state's costs of 15 administering this chapter. SUBCHAPTER C. REROOFING CONTRACTOR ADVISORY BOARD 16 17 Sec. 1306.101. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "advisory board" means the rer<u>oofing contractor advisory board.</u> 18 19 Sec. 1306.102. REROOFING CONTRACTOR ADVISORY BOARD. (a) The reroofing contractor advisory board shall advise the commission 20 on educational matters, operational matters, and common practices 21 22 in the reroofing industry. (b) Section 2110.003, Government Code, does not apply to the 23 24 advisory board. Sec. 1306.103. ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERSHIP. (a) 25 The 26 advisory board is composed of seven members as follows: (1) six members appointed by the presiding officer of 27

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1	the commission with the commission's approval as follows:
2	(A) four members who are licensed reroofing
3	contractors; and
4	(B) two public members; and
5	(2) one member who is the administrative head, or the
6	administrative head's designee, of a state agency or office that is
7	selected by the commission.
8	(b) The advisory board members must include two members who
9	are affiliated with a statewide association of reroofing
10	contractors.
11	(c) In appointing advisory board members under Subsection
12	(a)(1)(A), the presiding officer of the commission shall consider
13	the geographical diversity of the members.
14	(d) Appointments to the advisory board shall be made without
15	regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or
16	national origin of the appointee.
17	Sec. 1306.104. ELIGIBILITY OF PUBLIC MEMBERS. A person is
18	not eligible for appointment as a public member of the advisory
19	board if the person or the person's spouse:
20	(1) is licensed by an occupational regulatory agency
21	in the reroofing or construction industry;
22	(2) is employed by or participates in the management
23	of an agency or business entity related to the reroofing or
24	construction industry; or
25	(3) has, other than as a consumer, a financial
26	interest in a business entity related to the reroofing or
27	construction industry.

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1	Sec. 1306.105. TERMS; VACANCIES. (a) Except as provided by
2	Subsection (b), advisory board members:
3	(1) serve terms of two years, with the terms expiring
4	on February 1 of each odd-numbered year; and
5	(2) may not consecutively serve more than two full
6	terms.
7	(b) The advisory board member appointed to the position
8	described by Section 1306.103(a)(2) is an ex officio member and
9	shall continue to serve during the time the member holds office.
10	(c) If a vacancy occurs during a term of a member other than
11	the member described by Section 1306.103(a)(2), the presiding
12	officer of the commission shall appoint a replacement who meets the
13	qualifications of the vacated position to serve for the remainder
14	of the term.
15	Sec. 1306.106. PRESIDING OFFICER. (a) The governor shall
16	designate a member of the advisory board as the presiding officer of
17	the board to serve in that capacity at the pleasure of the governor.
18	(b) The presiding officer of the advisory board must be a
19	licensed reroofing contractor.
20	SUBCHAPTER D. REROOFING CONTRACTOR LICENSE
21	Sec. 1306.151. REROOFING CONTRACTOR LICENSE; USE OF TITLE.
22	A reroofing contractor may not advertise that the company is
23	licensed by this state or use the title "licensed reroofing
24	contractor" unless the contractor holds a license issued under this
25	chapter.
26	Sec. 1306.152. APPLICATION. (a) An applicant for a
27	reroofing contractor license must submit an application to the

1	department on a form prescribed by the executive director.
2	(b) A person may obtain a license for more than one business
3	entity by applying separately for each entity as required by this
4	chapter.
5	(c) The application must be accompanied by:
6	(1) if the applicant is a sole proprietorship that
7	operates under a name other than the sole proprietor's legal name,
8	proof of an assumed name certificate issued by the secretary of
9	state reflecting the business name;
10	(2) if the applicant is a business entity, proof of the
11	applicant's existence and confirmation of authority to conduct
12	business in this state under a certificate of status issued by the
13	secretary of state that is in good standing;
14	(3) proof of the mailing address and telephone number
15	of the applicant's residence or business location;
16	(4) proof that the applicant satisfies the general
17	liability insurance coverage and surety bond requirements
18	established by commission rule; and
19	(5) the application fee established by commission
20	<u>rule.</u>
21	(d) The department shall conduct an examination of any
22	criminal conviction of an applicant, including obtaining any
23	criminal history record information permitted by law.
24	Sec. 1306.153. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE; LICENSE NUMBER. (a)
25	Not later than the 10th day after the date the department receives
26	the application, the department shall issue a license to an
27	applicant who complies with the license requirements of this

1	chapter.
2	(b) A license initially issued under this chapter must
3	include a unique license number. Any renewal of the license must
4	include the number included in the initial issuance of the license.
5	(c) A license issued under this chapter is not assignable or
6	transferable.
7	Sec. 1306.154. LICENSE TERM. A license issued under this
8	chapter is valid for two years from the date of issuance and may be
9	renewed before expiration in the manner provided by Section
10	<u>1306.155.</u>
11	Sec. 1306.155. RENEWAL OF LICENSE. (a) To renew a license,
12	a reroofing contractor must submit an application for renewal to
13	the department on a form prescribed by the executive director.
14	(b) The application must be accompanied by:
15	(1) documentation of any changes in the reroofing
16	contractor's information submitted to the department under Section
17	1306.152(c); and
18	(2) the renewal fee established by commission rule.
19	Sec. 1306.156. LICENSE DATABASE. The department shall make
20	available on the department's Internet website a publicly
21	accessible list of all licensed reroofing contractors who are in
22	good standing. The list must be searchable by name and location.
23	The list must contain the following information for each licensed
24	reroofing contractor:
25	(1) the name, mailing address, and telephone number of
26	the reroofing contractor;
27	(2) a summary of any disciplinary action taken by the

1	department against the reroofing contractor; and
2	(3) any other information required by the department.
3	Sec. 1306.157. LICENSE VERIFICATION. On request of a
4	county or municipal building official, the department shall verify
5	the license status of a reroofing contractor. The department shall
6	establish a verification system to ensure a timely response to a
7	request for license status verification of a reroofing contractor.
8	SUBCHAPTER E. PRACTICE BY LICENSE HOLDER
9	Sec. 1306.201. DISCLOSURE OF LICENSE NUMBER. A licensed
10	reroofing contractor shall include the contractor's license number
11	in each:
12	(1) contract for a reroofing project in the manner
13	provided by Section 1306.202; and
14	(2) advertisement for a reroofing service by the
15	contractor, including on each business card, flyer, or door card
16	and in each television, radio, social media, or newspaper
17	advertisement.
18	Sec. 1306.202. CONTRACT FOR REROOFING PROJECT. (a) Before
19	engaging in a reroofing project, a licensed reroofing contractor
20	must provide to the property owner a written contract that is signed
21	by the reroofing contractor and the property owner.
22	(b) The written contract must include:
23	(1) the reroofing contractor's contact information,
24	including physical address, e-mail address, and telephone number;
25	(2) the reroofing contractor's policy regarding
26	cancellation of the contract, which must be consistent with state
27	law;

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1	(3) the reroofing contractor's license number in at
2	least 12-point bold type in the following form: "Texas Licensed
3	Reroofing Contractor Number (license number)"; and
4	(4) the department's contact information for
5	complaints directed to the department.
6	SUBCHAPTER F. ENFORCEMENT
7	Sec. 1306.251. INVESTIGATION OF COMPLAINTS. (a) The
8	department shall investigate any complaint alleging a violation of
9	this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter.
10	(b) A complaint must be filed in the manner prescribed by
11	the department.
12	Sec. 1306.252. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. The commission or
13	executive director may impose an administrative penalty on a person
14	under Subchapter F, Chapter 51, if the person violates:
15	(1) this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter;
16	or
17	(2) an order of the commission or executive director.
18	Sec. 1306.253. ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTIONS. The commission
19	may impose sanctions as provided by Section 51.353.
20	Sec. 1306.254. CIVIL PENALTY. The attorney general or
21	executive director may institute an action for a civil penalty
22	under this chapter as provided by Section 51.352. The amount of a
23	civil penalty assessed under this section may not exceed \$500 for
24	each violation.
25	SECTION 2. Not later than April 1, 2026, the Texas
26	Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt the rules,

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27 procedures, and fees necessary to administer Chapter 1306,

1 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

2 SECTION 3. The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation 3 is not required to begin issuing licenses under Chapter 1306, 4 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, before June 1, 2026.

5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
