Subchapter A-1, Chapter 614, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 614.014 to read as follows: 10 11 Sec. 614.014. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 12 (1) "Employer" means a governmental entity that employs or appoints a peace officer, fire fighter, or 13 14 telecommunicator or that the peace officer or fire fighter is elected to serve. 15 (2) "Fire fighter" and "peace officer" have the 16 meanings assigned by Section 614.001. 17 18 (3) "Telecommunicator" means a person authorized to act as a telecommunicator under Section 1701.405, Occupations Code. 19 SECTION 3. Section 614.015, Government Code, is amended to 20 21 read as follows: Sec. 614.015. MENTAL HEALTH LEAVE FOR PEACE OFFICERS, FIRE 22 23 FIGHTERS, AND TELECOMMUNICATORS. (a) [In this section: [(1) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of the 24

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state or of a political subdivision of the state authorized by law 1 to employ peace officers. 2 [(2) "Telecommunicator" means a person authorized to 3 act as a telecommunicator under Section 1701.405, Occupations Code. 4 5 [(b)] Each employer [law enforcement agency, and each agency of the state or of a political subdivision of the state that 6 employs a full-time telecommunicator,] shall develop and adopt a 7 8 policy allowing the use of mental health leave by the employer's peace officers, fire fighters, and full-time telecommunicators, as 9 applicable, [employed by the agency] who experience a traumatic 10 event in the scope of performing their duties as peace officers, 11 12 fire fighters, and telecommunicators for the employer [that employment]. 13 14 (b) [(c)] A mental health leave policy adopted under this 15 section must: 16 (1)provide clear and objective guidelines 17 establishing the circumstances under which a peace officer, fire fighter, or telecommunicator is granted and may use mental health 18 19 leave; entitle peace officer, fire fighter, 20 (2) а or telecommunicator to mental health leave without a deduction in 21 salary or other compensation; 22 enumerate the number of mental health leave days 23 (3) 24 available to a peace officer, fire fighter, or telecommunicator; 25 and 26 (4) detail the level of anonymity for a peace officer, fire fighter, or telecommunicator who takes mental health leave. 27

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1 (c) [(d)] A mental health leave policy adopted under this
2 section may provide a list of mental health services available to
3 peace officers, fire fighters, and telecommunicators in the area
4 where the employer is located [of the law enforcement or employing
5 agency].

6 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date 7 of this Act, each employer, as defined by Section 614.014, 8 Government Code, as added by this Act, shall develop a mental health 9 leave policy required by Section 614.015, Government Code, as 10 amended by this Act.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
