H.B. No. 3466

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the cancellation of certain consumer transactions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 601.002(b), Business & Commerce Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), this chapter does not apply to:

(1) a purchase of farm equipment;

(2) an insurance sale regulated by the Texas Department of Insurance;

(3) a sale of goods or services made:

(A) under a preexisting revolving charge account or retail charge agreement; or

(B) after negotiations between the parties at a business establishment in a fixed location where goods or services are offered or exhibited for sale; ~~or~~

(4) a sale of real property if:

(A) the purchaser is represented by a licensed attorney;

(B) the transaction is negotiated by a licensed real estate broker; or

(C) the transaction is negotiated at a place other than the consumer's residence by the person who owns the property;

1 (5) a service contract regulated under Chapter 1304,
2 Occupations Code, by the Texas Department of Licensing and
3 Regulation; or

4 (6) a sale of a service if:

5 (A) the service is cancellable by the consumer at
6 any time; and

7 (B) the right to cancel the service is provided
8 to the consumer in writing.

9 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
10 a consumer transaction that occurs on or after the effective date of
11 this Act. A consumer transaction that occurs before the effective
12 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the
13 transaction occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for
14 that purpose.

15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
