AN ACT

2 relating to the regulation of pharmacists and the practice of

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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 551.003(33), Occupations Code, is
- amended to read as follows: 8
- (33) "Practice of pharmacy" means: 9
- (A) providing an act or service necessary to 10
- provide pharmaceutical care; 11
- 12 (B) interpreting or evaluating a prescription
- 13 drug order or medication order;
- 14 (C) participating in drug or device selection as
- authorized by law, and participating in drug administration, drug 15
- regimen review, or drug or drug-related research; 16
- 17 (D) providing patient counseling;
- 18 (E) being responsible for:
- dispensing a prescription drug order or 19 (i)
- 20 distributing a medication order;
- 21 (ii) compounding or labeling a drug or
- 22 device, other than labeling by a manufacturer, repackager, or
- 23 distributor of a nonprescription drug or commercially packaged
- prescription drug or device; 24

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- 1 (iii) properly and safely storing a drug or
- 2 device; or
- 3 (iv) maintaining proper records for a drug
- 4 or device;
- 5 (F) performing for a patient a specific act of
- 6 drug therapy management delegated to a pharmacist by a written
- 7 protocol from a physician licensed in this state in compliance with

- 9 (G) <u>ordering or</u> administering an immunization or

- 16 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 554.004, Occupations

- SECTION 3. Section 554.004, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 21 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to
- 22 read as follows:
- 23 (a) The board shall specify conditions under which a
- 24 pharmacist may administer medication and order or administer [7
- 25 $\frac{\text{including}}{\text{including}}$ an immunization $\frac{\text{or}}{\text{or}}$ [and] vaccination. The conditions
- 26 for ordering or administering an immunization or vaccination must
- 27 ensure that:

[a licensed health care provider authorized to 1 (1)administer the medication is not reasonably available to administer 2 3 the medication; [(2) failure to administer the medication, other than 4 5 an immunization or vaccination, might result in a significant delay or interruption of a critical phase of drug therapy; 6 7 $\left[\frac{3}{3}\right]$ the pharmacist possesses the necessary skill, 8 education, and certification as specified by the board to order or administer the immunization or vaccination [medication]; 9 (2) not later than the third business day [(4) within 10 a reasonable time] after administering an immunization or 11 12 vaccination [medication], the pharmacist notifies the licensed health care provider responsible for the patient's care that the 13 14 immunization or vaccination [medication] was administered; 15 [(5) the pharmacist may not administer medication to a 16 patient at the patient's residence, except at a licensed nursing home or hospital; 17 [(6) the pharmacist administers an immunization 18 vaccination under a physician's written protocol and meets the 19 standards established by the board; and 20 21 (3) [(7)] the authority of a pharmacist to administer an immunization or vaccination [medication] may [not] be delegated 22 to a certified pharmacy technician who possesses the necessary 23 24 skill, education, and certification as specified by the board to administer the immunization or vaccination. 25 26 (a-1) A pharmacist satisfies the notice requirement of

Subsection (a)(2) if the immunization or vaccination administered

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- 1 by the pharmacist is recorded in the immunization registry
- 2 maintained by the state.
- 3 (a-2) A pharmacist shall inform the child receiving an
- 4 immunization or vaccination and the adult caregiver accompanying
- 5 the child of the importance of an annual well-child visit with a
- 6 pediatrician or other licensed primary health care provider.
- 7 SECTION 4. Sections 554.052(a), (b), (c), and (c-1),
- 8 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The board by rule shall require a pharmacist to notify a
- 10 physician who prescribes an immunization or vaccination not later
- 11 than the third business day [within 24 hours] after the date the
- 12 pharmacist administers the immunization or vaccination. A rule
- 13 adopted under this subsection must provide that a pharmacist
- 14 <u>satisfies the notice requirement if the immunization or vaccination</u>
- 15 is recorded in the immunization registry maintained by the state.
- 16 (b) The board shall establish minimum education and
- 17 continuing education standards for a pharmacist who orders or
- 18 administers an immunization or vaccination. The standards must
- 19 include federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
- 20 training, basic life support training, and hands-on training in
- 21 techniques for administering immunizations and vaccinations.
- (c) Supervision by a physician is adequate if the delegating
- 23 physician:
- 24 (1) is responsible for formulating or approving an
- 25 order or protocol, including the physician's order, standing
- 26 medical order, or standing delegation order, and periodically
- 27 reviews the order or protocol and the services provided to a patient

- 1 under the order or protocol;
- 2 (2) [except as provided by Subsection (c-1), has
- 3 established a physician-patient relationship with each patient
- 4 under 14 years of age and referred the patient to the pharmacist;
- 5 $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$ is geographically located to be easily
- 6 accessible to the pharmacy where an immunization or vaccination is
- 7 administered;
- 8 (3) $[\frac{(4)}{1}]$ receives, as appropriate, a periodic status
- 9 report on the patient, including any problem or complication
- 10 encountered; and
- 11 $(4) \left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ is available through direct
- 12 telecommunication for consultation, assistance, and direction.
- 13 (c-1) A pharmacist may order or administer [an influenza
- 14 vaccination] to a patient who is at least:
- 15 (1) three years of age an influenza immunization or
- 16 <u>vaccination and SARS-CoV-2 immunization or vaccination; and</u>
- 17 (2) five years of age an immunization or vaccination
- 18 if the immunization or vaccination is:
- (A) authorized or approved by the United States
- 20 Food and Drug Administration or listed in the routine immunization
- 21 schedule recommended by the federal Advisory Committee on
- 22 Immunization Practices published by the federal Centers for Disease
- 23 Control and Prevention; and
- 24 (B) ordered or administered in accordance with
- 25 the federal Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices
- 26 vaccine-specific recommendations [over seven years of age without
- 27 an established physician-patient relationship].

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

5 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
