- 2 relating to establishment of the Texas Rare Disease Advisory
- 3 Council.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Chapter 101A to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 101A. TEXAS RARE DISEASE ADVISORY COUNCIL
- 8 Sec. 101A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 9 <u>(1) "Advisory council" means the Texas Rare Disease</u>
- 10 Advisory Council established under this chapter.
- 11 (2) "Rare disease" means a disease, disorder, or
- 12 condition that affects fewer than 200,000 individuals in the United
- 13 States.
- Sec. 101A.002. ESTABLISHMENT. (a) The Texas Rare Disease
- 15 Advisory Council is established to advise the governor, state
- 16 agencies, and private entities that provide health care services or
- 17 <u>other treatment to individuals diagnosed with rare disease</u>s in this
- 18 state on strategies for improving health outcomes for those
- 19 individuals.
- 20 (b) The department shall provide to the advisory council
- 21 resources, personnel, and other administrative support as
- 22 necessary for the council to carry out its duties under this
- 23 chapter.
- Sec. 101A.003. ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS. (a) The advisory

1	council is composed of 23 members appointed as follows:		
2	(1) 11 members appointed by the governor as follows:		
3	(A) one representative of the department;		
4	(B) one representative of the commission;		
5	(C) one representative of the Texas Department of		
6	<pre>Insurance;</pre>		
7	(D) one representative of the Texas Education		
8	Agency;		
9	(E) one geneticist practicing in this state;		
10	(F) one registered nurse or advanced practice		
11	registered nurse licensed and practicing in this state with		
12	experience in treating rare diseases;		
13	(G) one hospital administrator of a hospital in		
14	this state that provides care to individuals diagnosed with a rare		
15	disease;		
16	(H) one pharmacist licensed and practicing in		
17	this state with experience dispensing prescription drugs used in		
18	treating rare diseases;		
19	(I) one representative of the biotechnology		
20	industry;		
21	(J) one representative of a health insurance		
22	company; and		
23	(K) one physician licensed and practicing in this		
24	state with experience in treating rare diseases;		
25	(2) six members appointed by the lieutenant governor		
26	as follows:		
27	(A) one representative of an academic research		

- 1 institution in this state that receives grant funding for rare
- 2 disease research;
- 3 (B) one physician licensed and practicing in this
- 4 state with experience in treating rare diseases;
- 5 (C) one individual who is 18 years of age or older
- 6 and who is diagnosed with a rare disease;
- 7 (D) two individuals who are, or previously served
- 8 as, caregivers for an individual diagnosed with a rare disease; and
- 9 <u>(E) one representative of an organization that</u>
- 10 provides care or other support to individuals diagnosed with a rare
- 11 disease in this state; and
- 12 (3) six members appointed by the speaker of the house
- 13 of representatives as follows:
- 14 (A) one representative of an academic research
- 15 <u>institution</u> in this state that receives grant funding for rare
- 16 <u>disease research;</u>
- 17 (B) one physician licensed and practicing in this
- 18 state with experience in treating rare diseases;
- 19 (C) one individual who is 18 years of age or older
- 20 and who is diagnosed with a rare disease;
- 21 (D) two individuals who are, or previously served
- 22 as, caregivers for an individual diagnosed with a rare disease; and
- (E) one representative of an organization that
- 24 provides care or other support to individuals diagnosed with a rare
- 25 disease in this state.
- 26 (b) Advisory council members serve staggered four-year
- 27 terms, with the terms of one-half of the members, or as near to

- 1 <u>one-half as possible, expiring February 1 of each odd-</u>numbered
- 2 year.
- 3 (c) A vacancy on the advisory council shall be filled for
- 4 the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 5 Sec. 101A.004. PRESIDING OFFICER; ASSISTANT PRESIDING
- 6 OFFICER. The governor shall annually select from among the
- 7 <u>advisory council members a presiding officer and an assistant</u>
- 8 presiding officer.
- 9 Sec. 101A.005. COUNCIL MEETINGS. (a) The advisory council
- 10 shall meet:
- 11 (1) at the call of the advisory council's presiding
- 12 officer; and
- 13 (2) on request by a majority of the advisory council
- 14 members.
- 15 (b) A majority of the voting members of the advisory council
- 16 constitutes a quorum.
- 17 (c) A meeting conducted under this section may be in person
- 18 or by video conference call, as determined by the advisory
- 19 council's presiding officer.
- 20 (d) The advisory council shall provide notice of upcoming
- 21 advisory council meetings on the department's Internet website.
- Sec. 101A.006. DUTIES. (a) The advisory council shall:
- 23 (1) consult with experts on rare diseases and solicit
- 24 public comment to develop policy recommendations for improving the
- 25 treatment of rare diseases in this state;
- 26 (2) develop strategy recommendations for academic
- 27 research institutions of higher education in this state to

- 1 <u>facilitate continued research on rare diseases;</u>
- 2 (3) develop strategy recommendations for health care
- 3 providers to better recognize and diagnose rare diseases to improve
- 4 patient treatment; and
- 5 (4) make recommendations to the department and other
- 6 state agencies on matters affecting individuals diagnosed with a
- 7 rare disease, including emergency preparedness and response
- 8 resources for a pandemic or natural disaster.
- 9 (b) The advisory council shall provide the department with
- 10 the strategy recommendations developed under Subsection (a)(3) for
- 11 publication on the department's Internet website.
- Sec. 101A.007. ANNUAL REPORT. (a) Not later than September
- 13 1 of each year, the advisory council shall prepare and submit to the
- 14 governor and commissioner a report that includes:
- 15 (1) a summary of the advisory council's activities for
- 16 the preceding year; and
- 17 (2) recommendations for legislative or other action on
- 18 rare disease research and care.
- 19 (b) The advisory council shall publish the report prepared
- 20 and submitted under Subsection (a) on the department's Internet
- 21 <u>website.</u>
- 22 <u>Sec. 101A.008. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Section</u>
- 23 2110.008, Government Code, does not apply to the advisory council.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2025, the appropriate
- 25 appointing authority shall appoint the initial members to the Texas
- 26 Rare Disease Advisory Council as required by Section 101A.003(a),
- 27 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, with the initial

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- 1 members' terms expiring as follows:
- 2 (1) the terms of five members appointed under Section
- 3 101A.003(a)(1), of three members appointed under Section
- 4 101A.003(a)(2), and of three members appointed under Section
- 5 101A.003(a)(3) expiring February 1, 2029; and
- 6 (2) the terms of six members appointed under Section
- 7 101A.003(a)(1), of three members appointed under Section
- 8 101A.003(a)(2), and of three members appointed under Section
- 9 101A.003(a)(3) expiring February 1, 2031.
- 10 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Section 101A.005, Health and
- 11 Safety Code, as added by this Act, the Texas Rare Disease Advisory
- 12 Council shall conduct the council's first meeting not later than
- 13 January 1, 2026.
- 14 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Section 101A.007, Health and
- 15 Safety Code, as added by this Act, the Texas Rare Disease Advisory
- 16 Council shall submit the first report required by that section not
- 17 later than September 1, 2026.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
