1 AN ACT 2 relating to the frequency of county bail bond board meetings. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 1704.055, Occupations Code, is amended 4 5 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: 6 7 (b) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [Subsection] (c) and (d), a board shall meet: 8 9 (1) at least once a month; and (2) at other times at the call of the presiding 10 11 officer. 12 (d) A board in a county with a population of less than 1.3 million and containing a municipality with a population of 750,000 13 14 or more shall meet: (1) at least six times each year during the months of 15 January, March, May, July, September, and November at the call of 16 17 the presiding officer; and 18 (2) at other times at the call of the presiding officer. 19 SECTION 2. Section 1704.162(h), Occupations Code, 20 is 21 amended to read as follows: 22 (h) Notwithstanding the expiration date of a license issued 23 under this chapter, if a board to which Section 1704.055(c) or (d) applies tables a license holder's application for renewal or 24

otherwise does not take action to approve or deny the application,
the applicant's current license continues in effect until the next
meeting of the board.

4 SECTION 3. Section 1704.162(h), Occupations Code, as 5 amended by this Act, applies only to an application for renewal of a 6 license filed with a county bail bond board on or after the 7 effective date of this Act. An application filed before that date 8 is governed by the law in effect at the time the application was 9 filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect July 1, 2025, if it 11 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 12 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 13 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that 14 date, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
