A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to eliminating the requirement for personal skills
- 3 instruction in public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 29.906, Education Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 29.906. CHARACTER TRAITS [AND PERSONAL SKILLS]
- 8 INSTRUCTION.
- 9 SECTION 2. Sections 29.906(a), (b), and (c), Education
- 10 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The State Board of Education shall integrate positive
- 12 character traits [and personal skills] into the essential knowledge
- 13 and skills adopted for kindergarten through grade 12, as
- 14 appropriate.
- 15 (b) The State Board of Education must include the following
- 16 positive character traits [and personal skills]:
- 17 (1) courage;
- 18 (2) trustworthiness, including honesty, reliability,
- 19 punctuality, and loyalty;
- 20 (3) integrity;
- 21 (4) respect and courtesy;
- 22 (5) responsibility, including accountability,
- 23 diligence, perseverance, [self-management skills,] and
- 24 self-control;

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- 1 (6) fairness, including justice and freedom from
- 2 prejudice;
- 3 (7) caring, including kindness, empathy, compassion,
- 4 consideration, patience, generosity, and charity[, and
- 5 interpersonal skills];
- 6 (8) good citizenship, including patriotism, concern
- 7 for the common good and the community, [responsible decision-making
- 8 skills, and respect for authority and the law;
- 9 (9) school pride; and
- 10 (10) gratitude.
- 11 (c) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school
- 12 must adopt a character education program that includes the positive
- 13 character traits [and personal skills] listed in Subsection (b).
- 14 In developing or selecting a character education program under this
- 15 section, a school district shall consult with a committee selected
- 16 by the district that consists of:
- 17 (1) parents of district students;
- 18 (2) educators; and
- 19 (3) other members of the community, including
- 20 community leaders.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
