 <u>Criminal Procedure, or a death investigator or employee who assists</u>
 <u>the justice of the peace or medical examiner.</u>

24 <u>(1-a)</u> "Emergency medical first responder" means an 25 employee or volunteer of the state, a political subdivision, or an 26 emergency medical services provider who provides urgent on-site 27 medical care to the sick or injured.

H.B. No. 3626 SECTION 4. Chapter 3106, Government Code, is amended by 1 adding Section 3106.0045 to read as follows: 2 Sec. 3106.0045. CORONERS' STAR OF TEXAS AWARD. (a) 3 The Coroners' Star of Texas Award shall be awarded to: 4 5 (1) each coroner who is seriously injured in the line 6 of duty; and 7 (2) the surviving next of kin of each coroner who is killed or sustains a fatal injury in the line of duty. 8 9 (b) The Coroners' Star of Texas Award Advisory Committee shall advise the governor on the issuance, design, and presentation 10 of the Coroners' Star of Texas Award. 11 (c) The committee consists of three current or retired 12 coroners appointed by the governor. 13 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act to Chapter 14 15 615, Government Code, applies only in relation to a death that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. 16 Matters 17 regarding eligibility, payment, and benefits under Chapter 615, Government Code, in relation to a death that occurs before the 18 effective date of this Act are governed by the law in effect when 19 the death occurs, and the former law is continued in effect for that 20 21 purpose. SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025. 22
