- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 162.235, Tax Code, is amended by adding

- 6 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a person who purchases
- 7 dyed diesel fuel and furnishes to the licensed supplier or
- 8 distributor under Section 162.206(a) a signed statement that
- 9 includes an end user number issued by the comptroller may operate a
- 10 motor vehicle on a public highway in this state with that dyed
- 11 diesel fuel in the fuel supply tank of the motor vehicle if the
- 12 motor vehicle is operated:
- (1) during a period for which the Internal Revenue
- 14 Service has specified that it will not impose a penalty when dyed
- 15 diesel fuel is sold for use or used on a public highway; and
- 16 (2) in an area that is included in an emergency or
- 17 major disaster as declared by the president of the United States
- 18 under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency
- 19 Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. Section 5121 et seq.) or following a
- 20 declaration of a state of disaster under Section 418.014,

- 22 SECTION 2. Section 621.102(d), Transportation Code, is

- Sec. 623.451. PERMIT TO DELIVER AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES.
- 21 (a) In this section, "agricultural commodity" means an
- 22 agricultural, horticultural, viticultural, silvicultural, or
- 23 vegetable product, bees or honey, planting seed, cottonseed, rice,
- 24 livestock or a livestock product, or poultry or a poultry product
- 25 that is produced in this state, either in its natural form or as
- 26 processed by the producer, including wood chips.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other state law, the department may

1 issue a special permit to an oversize or overweight vehicle or load 2 that: 3 (1) can easily be dismantled or divided; and 4 (2) will be used only to deliver agricultural 5 commodities to or from a site that is: 6 (A) located in an area included in an emergency 7 or major disaster declaration described by Subsection (c)(1); and 8 (B) affected by the emergency or major disaster for which the declaration described by Subsection (c)(1) was 9 10 issued. (c) The department may issue a permit under this section 11 12 only: (1) during an emergency or major disaster as declared 13

- Sec. 623.453. PERMIT CONDITIONS. The department may impose
- 12 conditions on a permit holder to ensure the safe operation of a
- 13 permitted vehicle and minimize damage to roadways, including
- 14 requirements related to vehicle routing, hours of operation, weight
- 15 <u>limits</u>, and lighting and requirements for escort vehicles.
- 16 Sec. 623.454. INTERSTATE AND DEFENSE HIGHWAYS AND FEDERAL
- 17 AID PRIMARY HIGHWAY SYSTEM. (a) This subchapter does not authorize
- 18 the operation on the national system of interstate and defense
- 19 highways or the federal aid primary highway system in this state of
- 20 a vehicle with a size or weight greater than those permitted under
- 21 <u>23 U.S.C. Section 127 or 49 U.S.C. Sections 31111 through 31114.</u>
- 22 (b) If the United States authorizes the operation on the
- 23 <u>national system of interstate and defense highways or the federal</u>
- 24 aid primary highway system of a vehicle with a size or weight
- 25 greater than those permitted under 23 U.S.C. Section 127 or 49
- 26 U.S.C. Sections 31111 through 31114 on September 1, 2025, the new
- 27 limit automatically takes effect on the national system of

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- 1 interstate and defense highways or the federal aid primary highway
- 2 system in this state.
- 3 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 4 162.235, Tax Code, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after
- 5 the effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurred before the
- 6 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 7 date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect
- 8 for that purpose. For purposes of this section, conduct occurred
- 9 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the conduct
- 10 occurred before that date.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
