## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Article 56B.102, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 5 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The [Before acting on an application for compensation
- 8 under this chapter, the] attorney general may make an emergency
- 9 award for anticipated pecuniary losses if it appears likely that:
- 10 (1) a final award will be made; and
- 11 (2) the claimant or victim will suffer undue hardship
- 12 if immediate economic relief is not obtained.
- 13 <u>(d) The limitations on emergency awards described by</u>
- 14 Subsections (a)(1) and (c) do not apply to an application for
- 15 compensation under this chapter:
- 16 (1) made by a claimant in relation to a deceased
- 17 victim; and
- 18 (2) arising from criminally injurious conduct that
- 19 resulted in a proclaimed state of emergency under Section 433.001,

- 21 SECTION 2. Article 56B.102, Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 22 amended by this Act, applies only to compensation for criminally
- 23 injurious conduct occurring on or after the effective date of this
- 24 Act. Compensation for criminally injurious conduct occurring

- 1 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 2 effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law is
- 3 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section,
- 4 criminally injurious conduct occurred before the effective date of
- 5 this Act if any element of the offense underlying the conduct
- 6 occurred before that date.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
