1 AN ACT 2 relating to the provision of certain information about Medicaid benefits in relation to newborn children. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, is amended by adding Section 32.0631 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 32.0631. ANNUAL NOTICE TO CERTAIN PROVIDERS REGARDING USE OF MEDICAID IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS WITH RESPECT TO NEWBORN 8 9 CHILDREN. The commission shall annually provide written notice to 10 each managed care organization and health care provider, including hospitals and other health care facilities participating in 11 Medicaid that regularly provide health care services to medical 12 assistance recipients who are pregnant women or newborn children: 13 14 (1) reminding the organizations and providers that when a newborn child of a recipient has not been assigned a Medicaid 15 identification number, the provider <u>may accept or use the</u> 16 recipient's Medicaid identification number on any claim for 17 reimbursement under Medicaid; and 18 19 (2) encouraging organizations and providers to educate recipients who are mothers or the prospective mothers of 20 newborn children that the recipient may use the recipient's 21 Medicaid identification number until the recipient's newborn child 22 23 is enrolled in Medicaid. 24 SECTION 2. Section 161.501(a), Health and Safety Code, is

- 12 parenting;
- 13 (B) information regarding the prevention of
- 14 shaken baby syndrome including:
- 15 (i) techniques for coping with anger caused
- 16 by a crying baby;
- 17 (ii) different methods for preventing a
- 18 person from shaking a newborn, infant, or other young child;
- 19 (iii) the dangerous effects of shaking a
- 20 newborn, infant, or other young child; and
- 21 (iv) the symptoms of shaken baby syndrome
- 22 and who to contact, as recommended by the American Academy of
- 23 Pediatrics, if a parent suspects or knows that a baby has been
- 24 shaken in order to receive prompt medical treatment;
- 25 (C) a list of diseases for which a child is
- 26 required by state law to be immunized and the appropriate schedule
- 27 for the administration of those immunizations;

- 1 (D) the appropriate schedule for follow-up
- 2 procedures for newborn screening;
- 3 (E) information regarding sudden infant death
- 4 syndrome, including current recommendations for infant sleeping
- 5 conditions to lower the risk of sudden infant death syndrome;
- 6 (F) educational information in both English and
- 7 Spanish on:
- 8 (i) pertussis disease and the availability
- 9 of a vaccine to protect against pertussis, including information on
- 10 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendation that
- 11 parents receive Tdap during the postpartum period to protect
- 12 newborns from the transmission of pertussis; and
- 13 (ii) the incidence of cytomegalovirus,
- 14 birth defects caused by congenital cytomegalovirus, and available
- 15 resources for the family of an infant born with congenital
- 16 cytomegalovirus; [and]
- 17 (G) the danger of heatstroke for a child left
- 18 unattended in a motor vehicle; and
- (H) information about Medicaid benefits for
- 20 children, including eligibility requirements and the process for
- 21 applying for those benefits;
- 22 (2) if the woman is a recipient of medical assistance
- 23 under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, provide the woman and the
- 24 father of the infant, if possible, or another adult caregiver with:
- 25 (A) a resource guide that includes information in
- 26 both English and Spanish relating to the development, health, and
- 27 safety of a child from birth until age five, including information

- 8 SECTION 3. (a) Not later than December 1, 2025:

- 11 (a)(2)(A)(x), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, in the
- 12 informational materials required by that section; and
- 13 (2) the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 14 develop the notice required by Section 161.501(a)(2)(B), Health and
- 15 Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 16 (b) Notwithstanding Section 161.501(a), Health and Safety
- 17 Code, as amended by this Act, a hospital, birthing center,
- 18 physician, nurse midwife, or midwife who provides prenatal care to
- 19 a pregnant woman during gestation or at delivery of an infant is not
- 20 required to comply with that provision until January 1, 2026.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
