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	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of certain information about Medicaid
3	benefits in relation to newborn children.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 32.0631 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 32.0631. ANNUAL NOTICE TO CERTAIN PROVIDERS REGARDING
8	USE OF MEDICAID IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS WITH RESPECT TO NEWBORN
9	CHILDREN. The commission shall annually provide written notice to
10	each managed care organization and health care provider, including
11	hospitals and other health care facilities participating in
12	Medicaid that regularly provide health care services to medical
13	assistance recipients who are pregnant women or newborn children:
14	(1) reminding the organizations and providers that
15	when a newborn child of a recipient has not been assigned a Medicaid
16	identification number, the provider may accept or use the
17	recipient's Medicaid identification number on any claim for
18	reimbursement under Medicaid; and
19	(2) encouraging organizations and providers to
20	educate recipients who are mothers or the prospective mothers of
21	newborn children that the recipient may use the recipient's
22	Medicaid identification number until the recipient's newborn child
23	is enrolled in Medicaid.
24	SECTION 2. Section 161.501(a), Health and Safety Code, is

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1 amended to read as follows:

2 (a) A hospital, birthing center, physician, nurse midwife,
3 or midwife who provides prenatal care to a pregnant woman during
4 gestation or at delivery of an infant shall:

5 (1) provide the woman and the father of the infant, if 6 possible, or another adult caregiver for the infant, with a 7 resource pamphlet that includes:

8 (A) a list of the names, addresses, and phone 9 numbers of professional organizations that provide postpartum 10 counseling and assistance to parents relating to postpartum 11 depression and other emotional trauma associated with pregnancy and 12 parenting;

(B) information regarding the prevention ofshaken baby syndrome including:

15 (i) techniques for coping with anger caused16 by a crying baby;

17 (ii) different methods for preventing a18 person from shaking a newborn, infant, or other young child;

19 (iii) the dangerous effects of shaking a20 newborn, infant, or other young child; and

(iv) the symptoms of shaken baby syndrome and who to contact, as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics, if a parent suspects or knows that a baby has been shaken in order to receive prompt medical treatment;

(C) a list of diseases for which a child is required by state law to be immunized and the appropriate schedule for the administration of those immunizations;

No. 3940 1 (D) the appropriate schedule for follow-up procedures for newborn screening; 2 3 (E) information regarding sudden infant death syndrome, including current recommendations for infant sleeping 4 5 conditions to lower the risk of sudden infant death syndrome; (F) educational information in both English and 6 7 Spanish on: 8 (i) pertussis disease and the availability of a vaccine to protect against pertussis, including information on 9 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendation that 10 parents receive Tdap during the postpartum period to protect 11 12 newborns from the transmission of pertussis; and 13 (ii) the incidence of cytomegalovirus, 14 birth defects caused by congenital cytomegalovirus, and available 15 resources for the family of an infant born with congenital cytomegalovirus; [and] 16 17 (G) the danger of heatstroke for a child left unattended in a motor vehicle; and 18 19 (H) information about Medicaid benefits for children, including eligibility requirements and the process for 20 applying for those benefits; 21 if the woman is a recipient of medical assistance 2.2 (2) under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, provide the woman and the 23 24 father of the infant, if possible, or another adult caregiver with: a resource guide that includes information in 25 (A) 26 both English and Spanish relating to the development, health, and safety of a child from birth until age five, including information 27

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1 relating to: 2 (i) [(A)] selecting and interacting with a 3 primary health care practitioner and establishing a "medical home" for the child; 4 5 (ii) [(B)] dental care; 6 (iii) [(C)] effective parenting; 7 (iv) [(D)] child safety; 8 (v) [(E)] the importance of reading to a 9 child; 10 (vi) [(F)] expected developmental 11 milestones; 12 (vii) [(G)] health care resources available in the state; 13 14 (viii) [(H)] selecting appropriate child 15 care; [and] 16 (ix) [(I)] other resources available in the 17 state; and 18 (x) how to contact the commission to report the child's birth for the purpose of enrolling the newborn child in 19 Medicaid; and 20 21 (B) a written notice developed by the commission informing the woman, father, or other caregiver that the newborn 22 child is automatically eligible for Medicaid and that the woman's 23 24 Medicaid identification number may be used on reimbursement claims for services provided to the woman's newborn child until the child 25 26 is enrolled in Medicaid and assigned a separate Medicaid identification number; 27

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1 (3) document in the woman's record that the woman 2 received the resource pamphlet described in Subdivision (1) and the 3 resource guide <u>and notice</u> described in Subdivision (2), if 4 applicable; and

5 (4) retain the documentation for at least five years 6 in the hospital's, birthing center's, physician's, nurse midwife's, 7 or midwife's records.

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SECTION 3. (a) Not later than December 1, 2025:

9 (1) the Department of State Health Services shall 10 include the information required by Sections 161.501(a)(1)(H) and 11 (a)(2)(A)(x), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, in the 12 informational materials required by that section; and

(2) the Health and Human Services Commission shall
develop the notice required by Section 161.501(a)(2)(B), Health and
Safety Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Notwithstanding Section 161.501(a), Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, a hospital, birthing center, physician, nurse midwife, or midwife who provides prenatal care to a pregnant woman during gestation or at delivery of an infant is not required to comply with that provision until January 1, 2026.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
