H. B. No. 4106

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to the duties of a pharmacist regarding medication
3 profiles for high-risk patients in certain hospitals.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is
6 amended by adding Section 562.1012 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 562.1012. MEDICATION PROFILE FOR HIGH-RISK PATIENTS IN
8 CERTAIN HOSPITALS. (a) This section applies only with respect to a
9 licensed hospital with more than 100 beds.

10 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a hospital
11 pharmacist shall obtain an accurate medication profile for each
12 high-risk patient, as determined by hospital policy, admitted to
13 the hospital.

14 (c) A pharmacist-intern or pharmacy technician may obtain
15 the medication profile described by Subsection (b) if the
16 pharmacist-intern or pharmacy technician meets the training
17 requirements provided by board rule.

18 (d) The pharmacist-in-charge of an institutional pharmacy
19 in a hospital shall develop and implement policies and procedures
20 consistent with board rules for obtaining a medication profile
21 under this section including determining the timeframe by which a
22 patient medication profile must be completed.

23 (e) The board shall adopt rules to implement this section,
24 including rules specifying:

1 (1) the contents of a patient medication profile
2 required under Subsection (b); and
3 (2) the training requirements for a pharmacist-intern
4 or pharmacy technician obtaining a medication profile.

5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
