## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to accelerated instruction for public school students who 3 fail to achieve satisfactory performance on certain assessment 4 instruments.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 28.0211(a-1), Education Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:

8 (a-1) Each time a student fails to perform satisfactorily on 9 an assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(a) or (1) in the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, or eighth grade or 10 an end-of-course assessment instrument administered under Section 11 12 39.023(c), other than an assessment instrument developed or adopted based on alternative academic achievement standards, the school 13 14 district in which the student attends school shall provide to the student accelerated instruction in the applicable subject area 15 16 [during the subsequent summer or school year] and, subject to 17 Subsections (a-7) and (a-8), either:

(1) allow the student to be assigned a classroom teacher who is certified as a master, exemplary, or recognized teacher under Section 21.3521 for the subsequent school year in the applicable subject area; or

(2) provide the student supplemental instructionunder Subsection (a-4).

24 SECTION 2. Sections 28.0211(a-2) and (a-3), Education Code,

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1 are repealed.

2 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 3 school year.

4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
