

AN ACT

relating to critical infrastructure facility emergency response maps and the critical infrastructure emergency response map grant program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 424, Government Code, is amended by adding Subchapter D to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER D. EMERGENCY RESPONSE MAP AND GRANT PROGRAM

Sec. 424.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

(1) "Division" means the Texas Division of Emergency Management.

(2) "Fund" means the critical infrastructure emergency response map fund created under Section 424.155.

(3) "Grant program" means the critical infrastructure emergency response map grant program established under Section 424.154.

(4) "Public safety agency" and "public safety answering point" have the meanings assigned by Section 771.001, Health and Safety Code.

Sec. 424.152. APPLICABILITY. (a) This subchapter applies only to a critical infrastructure facility that is:

(1) a public or private airport depicted in any current aeronautical chart published by the Federal Aviation Administration; or

1 (2) a military installation owned or operated by or
2 for this state or another governmental entity.

3 (b) A critical infrastructure facility to which this
4 subchapter applies is required to comply with the requirements of
5 this subchapter only if the facility is awarded a grant under
6 Section 424.154.

7 Sec. 424.153. EMERGENCY RESPONSE MAP AND TOUR. (a) Each
8 critical infrastructure facility to which this subchapter applies
9 shall provide to the division and appropriate public safety
10 agencies:

11 (1) an accurate emergency response map of the facility
12 that is developed in accordance with the standards described by
13 Subsection (b); and

14 (2) an opportunity to tour the facility using the map
15 described by Subdivision (1) to verify the map's accuracy.

16 (b) An emergency response map must:

17 (1) include:

18 (A) an accurate floor plan overlaid on current,
19 verified aerial imagery of the facility and its surrounding land
20 and a site-specific label for each building of the facility;

21 (B) a label for each:

22 (i) room;

23 (ii) named hallway; and

24 (iii) external door or stairwell number;

25 and

26 (C) the location of each:

27 (i) known hazard;

1 (ii) critical utility;

2 (iii) key box;

3 (iv) automated external defibrillator; and

4 (v) trauma kit;

5 (2) conform to, integrate with, and be accessible by
6 software used by the division, entities operating a local public
7 safety answering point, or appropriate public safety agencies
8 without imposing a fee or requiring the purchase of additional
9 software to access the map and associated data;

10 (3) be in a format capable of being printed, shared
11 electronically, or integrated into an interactive software
12 application; and

13 (4) be in a format easily modified or updated.

14 (c) A critical infrastructure facility to which this
15 subchapter applies may only provide an emergency response map to
16 the division and appropriate public safety agencies for purposes of
17 developing a verified source of critical infrastructure mapping
18 data in this state and ensuring efficient emergency response for
19 the facility.

20 (d) A critical infrastructure facility to which this
21 subchapter applies may not provide or make available to the public
22 an emergency response map.

23 Sec. 424.154. CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE EMERGENCY RESPONSE
24 MAP GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The division shall establish and administer
25 a grant program to provide mapping services for critical
26 infrastructure facilities to which this subchapter applies to
27 develop emergency response maps required under Section 424.153.

1 (b) A grant awarded under this section may only be used to
2 obtain mapping services for a critical infrastructure facility to
3 which this subchapter applies to provide the emergency response map
4 required under Section 424.153.

5 (c) A mapping service provider who is a recipient of grant
6 money shall provide an emergency response map to the critical
7 infrastructure facility, the division, and appropriate public
8 safety agencies and may only charge a fee for the initial production
9 cost for the map.

10 (d) The division shall adopt rules to administer the grant
11 program established under this section, including eligibility
12 standards and procedures for applying for a grant under this
13 section.

14 (e) The division may award a grant under the grant program
15 only in accordance with a contract between the division and a grant
16 recipient. The contract must include provisions under which the
17 division is granted sufficient control to ensure the public purpose
18 of providing emergency response mapping services to critical
19 infrastructure facilities to which this subchapter applies is
20 accomplished and the state receives a return benefit.

21 Sec. 424.155. CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE EMERGENCY RESPONSE
22 MAP FUND. (a) The critical infrastructure emergency response map
23 fund is a dedicated account in the general revenue fund
24 administered by the division.

25 (b) The fund consists of:

26 (1) legislative appropriations of money to the
27 division for deposit to the credit of the fund for purposes of this

1 subchapter;

2 (2) any revenue that by law is dedicated for deposit to
3 the fund;

4 (3) interest or other earnings on money credited to or
5 allocable to the fund; and

6 (4) gifts, grants, including federal grants, or
7 donations received by the division for the fund.

8 (c) Money in the fund may be appropriated only to the
9 division to administer the grant program and award grants under
10 Section 424.154.

11 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
12 of this Act, the Texas Division of Emergency Management shall
13 establish the grant program required under Section 424.154,
14 Government Code, as added by this Act.

15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
