Subchapter C, Chapter 40, Human Resources Code, is amended by adding Section 40.084 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 40.084. RETENTION OF GENETIC MATERIAL AND GENETIC 7 INFORMATION. (a) In this section: 8 9 (1) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid. (2) "Genetic information" means information related 10 to the genetic characteristics of an individual or the individual's 11 family that is derived from the results of a genetic analysis. 12 13 (3) "Genetic material" means blood or another specimen 14 that contains DNA. (4) "Genetic test" means an analysis of 15 an individual's genetic material to determine paternity. 16 (5) "Testing laboratory" means any entity the 17 department contracts with for the provision of laboratory services, 18 19 including genetic testing. 20 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the department and any testing laboratory used by the department shall promptly 21 destroy any genetic material and delete any genetic information 22 23 obtained from an individual for the purpose of a genetic test after the purpose for which the sample was obtained is accomplished. 24

1 (c) The department and a testing laboratory shall retain the 2 results of a genetic test. The results of a genetic test are 3 confidential under Section 40.005.

4 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2026, the Department of 5 Family and Protective Services and any testing laboratory used by 6 the department shall destroy all genetic material and delete 7 genetic information as required by Section 40.084, Human Resources 8 Code, as added by this Act.
