- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 21.001, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
- 6 (d) A person holding judicial office may not abandon,
- 7 abdicate, or otherwise relinquish the person's judicial authority
- 8 or duties vested in the office by the Texas Constitution, a state
- 9 statute, or the Code of Judicial Conduct.
- 10 (e) A person holding judicial office is subject to Section
- 11 1-a, Article V, Texas Constitution, and the Code of Judicial
- 12 Conduct regardless of whether the court the person serves has civil
- 13 <u>or criminal jurisdiction.</u>
- 14 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 81, Local Government Code,
- is amended by adding Section 81.0292 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 81.0292. PROHIBITED DELEGATION OF JUDICIAL AUTHORITY.
- 17 A commissioners court of a county may not adopt or enforce an order,
- 18 rule, or other measure that delegates the authority or duties
- 19 vested in a judicial office except as specifically authorized by
- 20 law.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
