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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the provision of workers' compensation insurance coverage for certain Texas Task Force 1 members and intrastate fire 3 4 mutual aid system team and regional incident management team 5 members. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 88.126(a)(2), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 8 (2) "Local government employee member" means a member 9 who is an employee, as defined by Section 504.001, Labor Code, of 10 [employed by] a local government, as defined by Section 102.001, 11 12 Civil Practice and Remedies Code. SECTION 2. Section 88.126, Education Code, is amended by 13 14 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows: (e) Service with an intrastate fire mutual aid system team 15 16 or a regional incident management team by a local government employee member who is activated is considered to be in the course 17 and scope of the employee's regular employment with the local 18 19 government. SECTION 3. Section 88.303, Education Code, is amended by 20 21 adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows: (c-1) Service with Texas Task Force 1 by a local government 22 23 employee member who is activated is considered to be in the course and scope of the employee's regular employment with the local 24

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1 government.

2 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 408.0445, Labor Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 408.0445. AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGE FOR MEMBERS OF STATE
MILITARY FORCES[, TEXAS TASK FORCE 1, INTRASTATE FIRE MUTUAL AID
SYSTEM TEAMS, AND REGIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAMS].

7 SECTION 5. Section 501.001(5), Labor Code, is amended to 8 read as follows:

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(5) "Employee" means a person who is:

in the service of the state pursuant to an 10 (A) election, appointment, or express oral or written contract of hire; 11 paid from state funds but whose duties 12 (B) require that the person work and frequently receive supervision in 13 14 a political subdivision of the state; 15 (C) a peace officer employed by a political 16 subdivision, while the peace officer is exercising authority 17 granted under: (i) Article 2A.001, Code of 18 Criminal 19 Procedure; or 20 (ii) Articles 14.03(d) and (g), Code of 21 Criminal Procedure; or 22 a member of the state military forces, as (D) defined by Section 437.001, Government Code, who is engaged in 23 24 authorized training or duty[+ 25 [(E) a Texas Task Force 1 member, as defined by 26 Section 88.301, Education Code, who is activated by the Texas Division of Emergency Management or is injured during training 27

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1 sponsored or sanctioned by Texas Task Force 1; or

[(F) an intrastate fire mutual aid system team member or a regional incident management team member, as defined by Section 88.126, Education Code, who is activated by the Texas Division of Emergency Management or is injured during training sponsored or sanctioned by the Texas Division of Emergency Management on behalf of an intrastate fire mutual aid system team or a regional incident management team, as applicable].

9 SECTION 6. Chapter 506, Labor Code, is amended by adding 10 Section 506.003 to read as follows:

Sec. 506.003. PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO MEMBERS OF TEXAS TASK FORCE 1, INTRASTATE FIRE MUTUAL AID SYSTEM TEAM, OR REGIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM. (a) This section applies only to an employee, as defined by Section 501.001, 502.001, 503.001, 504.001, or 505.001, who is:

16 (1) a member of Texas Task Force 1, as defined by 17 Section 88.302, Education Code, or a member of an intrastate fire 18 mutual aid system team or a regional incident management team, as 19 defined by Section 88.126, Education Code; and

20 <u>(2) activated by the Texas Division of Emergency</u> 21 <u>Management or is injured during training that is sponsored or</u> 22 <u>sanctioned by the Texas Division of Emergency Management or Texas</u> 23 <u>Task Force 1.</u>

(b) For purposes of workers' compensation coverage under
Chapter 501, 502, 503, 504, or 505, service with Texas Task Force 1,
an intrastate fire mutual aid system team, or a regional incident
management team, as applicable, by an employee is considered to be

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1	in the course and scope of the employee's regular employment with
2	the employer.
3	SECTION 7. The following provisions are repealed:
4	(1) Section 88.126(a)(4), Education Code;
5	(2) Section 88.126(b), Education Code;
6	(3) Section 88.301(3), Education Code;
7	(4) Section 88.303(a), Education Code;
8	(5) Sections 408.0445(b) and (c), Labor Code; and
9	(6) Sections 501.002(f) and (g), Labor Code.
10	SECTION 8. The change in law made by this Act applies only
11	to a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a
12	compensable injury that occurs on or after the effective date of
13	this Act. A claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before
14	the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on
15	the date the compensable injury occurred, and the former law is
16	continued in effect for that purpose.
17	SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
