- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 1603.051, Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1603.051. ADVISORY BOARD; MEMBERSHIP. The Barbering
- 10 and Cosmetology Advisory Board consists of nine members appointed
- 11 by the presiding officer of the commission, with the commission's
- 12 approval, as follows:

- 14 practitioner license under Subchapter E-1, including:
- 15 (A) at least one holder of a Class A barber
- 16 license; [and]
- 17 (B) at least one holder of a cosmetology operator

- (D) at least one holder of a cosmetology
- 22 <u>instructor license;</u>

5	SECTION 3. Subchapter E-1, Chapter 1603, Occupations Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 1603.21035 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1603.21035. ELIGIBILITY FOR BARBER INSTRUCTOR OR
8	COSMETOLOGY INSTRUCTOR LICENSE. (a) To be eligible for a barber
9	<pre>instructor or cosmetology instructor license, an applicant must:</pre>
10	(1) be at least 18 years of age;
11	(2) have a high school diploma or a high school
12	equivalency certificate;
13	(3) hold a current Class A barber license or
14	<pre>cosmetology operator license, as applicable;</pre>
15	(4) have completed a course consisting of 500 hours of
16	instruction in barber or cosmetology courses and methods of
17	teaching in a barber or cosmetology school or commission-approved
18	training program; and
19	(5) pass a written and practical examination
20	<pre>prescribed by the commission.</pre>
21	(b) The commission shall adopt rules for the licensing of
22	specialty instructors to teach specialty courses in any service
23	described by Section 1603.0011(a)(3), (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), or
24	(9) or (c).
25	SECTION 4. Not later than December 31, 2025, the Texas
26	Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules to
27	implement Section 1603.21035, Occupations Code, as added by this

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1 Act.

SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act to Section 2 1603.051, Occupations Code, does not affect the entitlement of a 4 member serving on the advisory committee established under that section immediately before the effective date of this Act to 5 6 continue to serve for the remainder of the member's term. As the terms of members expire after the effective date of this Act, the 7 presiding officer of the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation, with the commission's approval, shall appoint or reappoint members who have the qualifications required by that 10 11 section.

12 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
