5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 51.805(b), Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	(b) The general academic teaching institution, after
9	admitting students under Sections 51.803 and 51.804, shall admit
10	other applicants for admission as undergraduate students. It is
11	the intent of the legislature that all institutions of higher
12	education pursue academic excellence by considering students'
13	academic achievements in decisions related to admissions. <u>In</u>
14	making first-time freshmen admissions decisions, each [Because of

16	in the state, each] general academic teaching institution shall
17	also consider <u>:</u>
18	(1) the applicant's performance on a standardized test
19	appropriate for undergraduate admissions; and

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          SECTION 2. Section 51.842, Education Code, is amended by
    adding Subsections (a-1) and (b-1) and amending Subsection (b) to
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    read as follows:
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          (a-1) In making admissions decisions for the program, a
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    graduate or professional program of a general academic teaching

    institution or medical or dental unit shall consider an applicant's

    performance on a standardized test appropriate for the program,

    except that the applicant's performance on the standardized test
    may not be used as the sole criterion for consideration of the

    applicant or as the primary criterion to end consideration of the
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socioeconomic backgrounds;

applicant. The applicant's performance on the standardized test

- 1 must also be used to compare the applicant's test score with those
- 2 of other applicants from similar socioeconomic backgrounds to the
- 3 extent that those backgrounds can be properly determined and
- 4 identified by the general academic teaching institution or medical
- 5 and dental unit based on information provided in the institution's
- 6 or unit's admissions process.
- 7 An applicant's performance on a standardized test may 8 not be used in the [admissions or] competitive scholarship process for a graduate or professional program as the sole criterion for 9 10 consideration of the applicant or as the primary criterion to end consideration of the applicant. If an applicant's performance on a 11 12 standardized test is used in the [admissions or] competitive scholarship process, the applicant's performance must also be used 13 14 to compare the applicant's test score with those of other 15 applicants from similar socioeconomic backgrounds to the extent that those backgrounds can be properly determined and identified by 16 17 the general academic teaching institution or medical and dental unit based on information provided in the institution's or unit's 18 19 [admissions or] competitive scholarship process.
- 20 (b-1) Subsections (a-1) and (b) do [This subsection does]
 21 not apply to a standardized test used to measure the English
 22 language proficiency of a student who is a graduate of a foreign
 23 institution of higher education.
- SECTION 3. Sections 51.805 and 51.842, Education Code, as amended by this Act, apply beginning with admissions for the 2026 fall semester. Admissions for an academic period before the 2026 fall semester are governed by the law in effect immediately before

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- 1 the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 2 effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
