BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 241.023, Health and Safety Code, is d by amending Subsections (c-1) and (c-2) and adding amended by Subsection (h) to read as follows: 1-24 1-25 (c-1)

The department may issue:

(1) one license for multiple hospitals if:

(A) [(1)] all buildings in which inpatients receive hospital services and inpatient services of each of the 1-27 1-28 1-29 hospitals to be included in the license are subject to the control 1-30 and direction of the same governing body;
