5	SECTION 1. Chapter 481, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter HH to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER HH. TEXAS QUANTUM INITIATIVE
8	Sec. 481.681. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Advisory committee" means the advisory committee
10	of the initiative.
11	(2) "Initiative" means the Texas Quantum Initiative.
12	(3) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
13	assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
14	Sec. 481.682. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSES. (a) The Texas
15	Quantum Initiative is a program established within the office to:
16	(1) establish and advance this state's position as a
17	national leader in the quantum industry; and
18	(2) accelerate the integration of quantum computing,
19	networking, and sensing technology into the economy of this state.
20	(b) The purposes of the initiative are to:
21	(1) leverage the expertise and capacity of regulatory
22	stakeholders and institutions of higher education and industry to
23	advise and provide input to the office regarding the comprehensive
24	strategic plan described by Section 481.686;

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- 1 (2) identify obstacles and provide recommendations to
- 2 the governor and legislature regarding quantum economic
- 3 opportunities and technologies;
- 4 (3) provide strategic leadership with respect to
- 5 quantum initiatives;
- 6 (4) identify opportunities for workforce training and
- 7 development related to the research, design, and manufacturing of
- 8 quantum computing technology; and
- 9 (5) identify opportunities to support:
- 10 (A) existing quantum computing and networking
- 11 industries in this state; and
- 12 (B) the development of a quantum manufacturing
- 13 supply chain in this state.
- 14 (c) The initiative may establish ad hoc advisory committees
- 15 as necessary to carry out the initiative's duties under this
- 16 <u>subchapter.</u>
- 17 Sec. 481.683. ADVISORY COMMITTEE COMPOSITION. (a) The
- 18 initiative is advised by an advisory committee composed of six
- 19 members appointed by the governor.
- 20 (b) In making appointments under Subsection (a), priority
- 21 shall be given to individuals from the quantum design and
- 22 <u>manufacturing sectors.</u>
- 23 (b-1) Appointments to the advisory committee shall be made
- 24 without regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age,
- 25 or national origin of the appointee.
- 26 (c) In making appointments under Subsection (a), the
- 27 governor shall ensure that the members of the advisory committee

- 1 <u>include:</u>
- 2 (1) at least one representative from a quantum
- 3 infrastructure provider who has demonstrated experience in:
- 4 (A) implementing quantum networks in similar
- 5 settings; and
- 6 (B) deploying leading edge quantum computing
- 7 systems in third-party data centers; and
- 8 (2) at least one representative of a manufacturer of a
- 9 quantum computing system with the ability to enable the creation
- 10 and deployment of quantum solutions with commercial and practical
- 11 use.
- 12 (d) An advisory committee member serves a six-year term at
- 13 the pleasure of the governor. The terms of advisory committee
- 14 members must be staggered so that, to the extent practicable, the
- 15 terms of one-third of advisory committee members expire on January
- 16 <u>31 of each odd-numbered year.</u> An advisory committee member may be
- 17 reappointed for additional terms.
- 18 <u>(e) A vacancy on the advisory committee shall be filled by</u>
- 19 the governor.
- 20 (f) Advisory committee members serve without compensation
- 21 but are entitled to reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in
- 22 <u>attending committee meetings. Reimbursements under this subsection</u>
- 23 may be paid from the fund established under Section 481.688.
- 24 (g) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the size, composition, or
- 25 duration of the advisory committee.
- Sec. 481.684. DIRECTOR; STAFF. The office shall hire a
- 27 director. The director shall hire and direct staff to assist the

- 1 initiative in performing the initiative's duties under this
- 2 subchapter.
- 3 Sec. 481.685. DUTIES OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The advisory
- 4 committee shall:
- 5 (1) advise and provide input to the office regarding
- 6 the comprehensive strategic plan described by Section 481.686;
- 7 (2) solicit recommendations from institutions of
- 8 higher education, initiative members, and stakeholders on funding
- 9 and research opportunities related to quantum education and
- 10 research, design, commercialization, community outreach, and
- 11 manufacturing projects; and
- 12 (3) provide recommendations related to research and
- 13 funding opportunities pertaining to quantum research, design,
- 14 commercialization, and manufacturing.
- Sec. 481.686. STRATEGIC PLAN. (a) The office shall, in
- 16 collaboration with the initiative, develop a strategic plan for the
- 17 promotion of the quantum economy in this state. The plan must
- 18 include:
- 19 (1) a list of potential projects that further the
- 20 goals of the initiative;
- 21 (2) a list of federal grant opportunities that are
- 22 related to quantum technology and for which institutions in this
- 23 state are eligible to apply;
- 24 (3) an assessment of the availability of external
- 25 funding sources for each project identified under Subdivision (1);
- 26 (4) a description of suggested methods and
- 27 opportunities the state may use to promote the development of

- 1 quantum technologies in this state;
- 2 (5) a description of suggested approaches the state
- 3 may use to ensure the quantum leadership of this state by
- 4 prioritizing commercial and practical utility through investments
- 5 in necessary foundational infrastructure, including quantum
- 6 systems and networking equipment, jobs and workforce, and real
- 7 property; and
- 8 (6) any other information the office, in collaboration
- 9 with the advisory committee, determines is relevant to further the
- 10 initiative's goals.
- 11 (b) The office shall submit the strategic plan required by
- 12 this section not later than December 31 of each year to the
- 13 governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 14 representatives.
- Sec. 481.687. BIENNIAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of
- 16 each even-numbered year, the office shall prepare and submit to the
- 17 Legislative Budget Board a written report that outlines:
- 18 (1) activities undertaken to meet the purposes of the
- 19 initiative under Section 481.682;
- 20 (2) a summary of the funding and research
- 21 opportunities identified by the advisory committee with the input
- 22 of the office;
- 23 (3) any legislative recommendations to further the
- 24 purposes of the initiative;
- 25 (4) any prospective grants or funding the initiative
- 26 expects to apply for or receive; and
- 27 (5) any research accomplishments associated with the

- 1 <u>initiative</u>.
- 2 Sec. 481.688. QUANTUM UNIVERSITY AND BUSINESS INNOVATION
- 3 FOR TEXAS FUND. (a) In this section, "fund" means the Quantum
- 4 University and Business Innovation for Texas Fund created by this
- 5 section.
- 6 (b) The Quantum University and Business Innovation for
- 7 Texas Fund is created as a dedicated account within the general
- 8 revenue fund. The fund consists of:
- 9 (1) gifts, grants, or donations to the fund;
- 10 (2) money from any other source designated by the
- 11 legislature; and
- 12 (3) interest earned from investing money from the
- 13 fund.
- 14 (c) The office may use money in the fund to:
- 15 (1) award grants to state entities, including
- 16 <u>institutions of higher education</u>, for quantum manufacturing and
- 17 design projects;
- 18 (2) award grants to business entities, including
- 19 nonprofit organizations with a purpose associated with or
- 20 significant ties to the quantum industry, to encourage economic
- 21 development related to quantum manufacturing and design projects;
- 22 and
- 23 (3) pay for staffing costs described by Section
- 24 481.684.
- 25 (d) Matching funding to state entities for quantum
- 26 manufacturing and design projects may come from any lawful source,
- 27 including general revenue, local bonds, grants, or other money from

- 1 the United States, or private endowments.
- 2 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2026, the governor
- 3 shall make the initial appointments to the advisory committee of
- 4 the Texas Quantum Initiative established by Section 481.683,
- 5 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. (a) Notwithstanding any other section of this
- 7 Act, in a state fiscal year, a state agency to which this Act
- 8 applies is not required to implement a provision found in another
- 9 section of this Act that is drafted as a mandatory provision
- 10 imposing a duty on the agency to take an action unless money is
- 11 specifically appropriated to the agency for that fiscal year to
- 12 carry out that duty. The agency may implement the provision in that
- 13 fiscal year to the extent other funding is available to the agency
- 14 to do so.
- 15 (b) If, as authorized by Subsection (a) of this section, the
- 16 state agency does not implement the mandatory provision in a state
- 17 fiscal year, the state agency, in its legislative budget request
- 18 for the next state fiscal biennium, shall certify that fact to the
- 19 Legislative Budget Board and include a written estimate of the
- 20 costs of implementing the provision in each year of that next state
- 21 fiscal biennium.
- (c) This section expires and any duty suspended by
- 23 Subsection (a) becomes mandatory on September 1, 2029.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
