(1) the <u>individual's</u> [person's] certificate or license to engage in a profession in this state or elsewhere has been revoked for unprofessional conduct, fraud, deceit, negligence, or misconduct in the practice of the profession; or

(2) satisfactory proof is presented to the commission
or executive director establishing that the <u>individual</u> [person] has
been found guilty of unprofessional conduct, fraud, deceit,
negligence, or misconduct in the practice of a profession.

SECTION 10. Sections 1953.151(b) and (c), Occupations Code, are repealed.

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SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
