A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to duties of the vital statistics unit of the Department of
- 3 State Health Services in relation to certain suits affecting the
- 4 parent-child relationship, including in regard to the electronic

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 155.101, Family Code, is amended by
- 8 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 (b) The vital statistics unit shall, on the [written]
- 11 request of the Department of Family and Protective Services, the
- 12 court, an attorney, or a party:
- 13 (1) identify the court that last had continuing,
- 14 exclusive jurisdiction of the child in a suit and give the docket
- 15 number of the suit; or
- 16 (2) state that the child has not been the subject of a
- 17 suit.
- (e) Using existing resources, the vital statistics unit
- 19 shall establish an electronic process through which the Department
- 20 of Family and Protective Services may request information under
- 21 this section.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 160.422, Family Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (b) to read as
- 24 follows:

- 1 (a-1) Using existing resources, the vital statistics unit
- 2 shall establish an electronic process through which the Department
- 3 of Family and Protective Services may request information under
- 4 this section.
- 5 (b) The certificate of the results of a search must include
- 6 <u>a digitized or written signature</u> [be signed] on behalf of the unit
- 7 and state that:
- 8 (1) a search has been made of the registry; and
- 9 (2) a registration containing the information
- 10 required to identify the registrant:
- 11 (A) has been found and is attached to the
- 12 certificate; or
- 13 (B) has not been found.
- 14 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 15 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 16 Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement the
- 17 changes in law made by this Act.
- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 19 a request received by the vital statistics unit of the Department of
- 20 State Health Services on or after January 1, 2026. A request
- 21 received before January 1, 2026, is governed by the law in effect
- 22 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former
- 23 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
