Section 155.101, Family Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (e) to read as 8 9 follows: The vital statistics unit shall, on the [written] 10 (b) request of the Department of Family and Protective Services, the 11 12 court, an attorney, or a party: 13 (1) identify the court that last had continuing, 14 exclusive jurisdiction of the child in a suit and give the docket number of the suit; or 15 (2) state that the child has not been the subject of a 16 suit. 17 18 (e) Using existing resources, the vital statistics unit shall establish an electronic process through which the Department 19 of Family and Protective Services may request information under 20 this section. 21 22 SECTION 2. Section 160.422, Family Code, is amended by 23 adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (b) to read as 24 follows:

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(a-1) Using existing resources, the vital statistics unit 1 shall establish an electronic process through which the Department 2 of Family and Protective Services may request information under 3 4 this section. 5 (b) The certificate of the results of a search must include a digitized or written signature [be signed] on behalf of the unit 6 7 and state that: 8 (1) a search has been made of the registry; and information 9 (2) registration containing the а 10 required to identify the registrant: (A) has been found and is attached to the 11 certificate; or 12 (B) has not been found. 13 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date 14 15 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement the 16 17 changes in law made by this Act. SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 18 a request received by the vital statistics unit of the Department of 19 State Health Services on or after January 1, 2026. A request 20 received before January 1, 2026, is governed by the law in effect 21 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former 22 23 law is continued in effect for that purpose. 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
