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- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. Chapter 28.025(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (c) A person may receive a diploma if the person is eligible
- 11 for a diploma under Section 28.0251. In other cases, a student may
- 12 graduate and receive a diploma only if:
- 13 (1) the student successfully completes the curriculum
- 14 requirements identified by the State Board of Education under
- 15 Subsection (a) and complies with Sections 28.0256, 28.0257, and
- 16 39.025; or
- 17 (2) the student successfully completes an
- 18 individualized education program developed under Section 29.005.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 28.0257, Education Code, is added to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 Sec.28.0257. DIRECT ADMISSIONS DATA SHARING OPT-IN ELECTION
- 22 FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION. (a) In this section:
- 23 (1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
- 24 Education Coordinating Board.

- 1 (2) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
- 2 assigned by Section 61.003.
- 3 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), before graduating
- 4 from high school, each student must elect whether to opt-in to
- 5 allowing the coordinating board to share the student's data and
- 6 education records, as necessary, with institutions of higher
- 7 education to allow the student to participate in the direct
- 8 admissions program established by the Coordinating Board pursuant
- 9 to Education Code 61.0511(b)(2).
- 10 (c) A student is not required to comply with Subsection (b)
- 11 if:
- 12 (1) The student's parent or other person standing in
- 13 parental relation submits a signed form indicating that the parent
- 14 or other person authorizes the student to decline to complete and
- 15 submit information necessary to participate in a program offered
- 16 <u>under subsection (b);</u>
- 17 (2) The student signs and submits the form described
- 18 by Subdivision (1) on the student's own behalf if the student is 18
- 19 years of age or older or the student's disabilities of minority have
- 20 been removed for general purposes under Chapter 31, Family Code; or
- 21 (3) A school counselor authorizes in writing the
- 22 student to decline to complete and submit the information necessary
- 23 to participate in a program offered under subsection (b).
- 24 (d) Each school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 25 shall use a form adopted by the Coordinating Board, in consultation
- 26 with the Texas Education Agency, to allow a student to opt-out
- 27 pursuant to subsection (c). The form shall:

- 1 (1) Provide the student or the student's parent or
- 2 other person standing in parental relation, as applicable, the
- 3 opportunity to elect whether to share the student's data or
- 4 education records, as necessary, with institutions of higher
- 5 education to facilitate the student's participation in a program
- 6 offered under subsection (b); and
- 7 (2) Be made available in English, Spanish, and any
- 8 other language spoken by a majority of the students enrolled in a
- 9 bilingual education or special language program under Subchapter B,
- 10 Chapter 29, in the district or school.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 12 amended by adding subsection 51.763(d) to read as follows:
- 13 (d) Each institution of higher education shall publish
- 14 prominently on its admission application website a link to
- 15 MyTexasFuture.Org or its successor electronic platform and provide
- 16 <u>notice to students that they may apply to the institution using the</u>
- 17 <u>electronic common admission application form found in</u>
- 18 ApplyTexas.Org or via MyTexasFuture.Org.
- 19 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Section 61.0511 to read as follows:
- 21 Sec. 61.0511. Direct Admissions and Financial Aid Portal at
- 22 MyTexasFuture.Org.
- 23 <u>(a) The board shall create, maintain, and administer an</u>
- 24 electronic platform and submission portal, known as My Texas Future
- 25 (MyTexasFuture.Org), to facilitate the awareness and application
- 26 of students into institutions of higher education.
- 27 (b) My Texas Future, or any successor electronic platform

- 1 <u>established pursuant to this section, shall include:</u>
- 2 (1) A link or direct submission portal to the
- 3 electronic common admission application form adopted and
- 4 established pursuant to Section 51, Subchapter S;
- 5 (2) A Direct Admission's program that lists
- 6 institution of higher education to which a student may be directly
- 7 admitted based on the student's profile and information;
- 8 (3) To the greatest extent possible, a list of
- 9 financial aid awards that a student may be eligible to receive
- 10 based on the student's profile and information; and
- 11 (4) The data required by Section 61.09022 to assist
- 12 students in assessing the value of post-secondary credentials by
- 13 program.
- 14 (c) A Texas school district or an open-enrollment charter
- 15 school shall as part of the high school registration process
- 16 annually notify, in a manner prescribed by coordinating board rule,
- 17 each parent or guardian of a student who has earned at least three
- 18 high school course credits or not later than the end of a student's
- 19 first semester of ninth grade:
- 20 (1) Of the option to create or update annually a
- 21 profile and account in My Texas Future;
- 22 (2) That a student or their parent is permitted to
- 23 update or revise their own profile in My Texas Future;
- 24 (3) That a student or parent of a student who creates a
- 25 profile and account under this section, may opt-out of one or more
- 26 programs offered under Subsection (b); and
- 27 (4) Of the graduation requirement under Section

- 1 28.0257 for a student or parent to indicate whether the student
- 2 wishes to opt-in to allowing the board to share the student's data
- 3 and educational records with institutions of higher education for
- 4 the purpose of participating in the Direct Admissions Program
- 5 established under Subsection (b)(2).
- 6 (d) The Texas Education Agency and the Coordinating Board
- 7 shall jointly prepare and post on their respective Internet
- 8 websites a publication that includes the information required to be
- 9 provided under subsection (c) in a form that enables a school
- 10 <u>district or open-enrollment charter school to reproduce the</u>
- 11 publication for distribution under that subsection.
- 12 (e) The Texas Education Agency and each Texas public school
- 13 district or open -enrollment charter school shall make the data
- 14 available to the Coordinating Board necessary to administer this
- 15 <u>Section.</u>
- 16 <u>(f) The board may adopt rules necessary to implement this</u>
- 17 section.
- 18 (g) The board may share a student's contact information in
- 19 MyTexasFuture.Org with an institution of higher education unless
- 20 the student opts-out of sharing the student's contact information.
- 21 Any student information shared with an institution of higher
- 22 education is confidential pursuant to subsection (1). The board
- 23 shall ensure that a student may opt-out of sharing the student's
- 24 contact information with an institution of higher education.
- 25 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, except
- 26 as provided by this section, information that relates to a current,
- 27 former, or prospective applicant or student of an educational

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- 1 institution and that is obtained, received, or held by the board for
- 2 the purpose of administering this section or otherwise providing
- 3 assistance with access to postsecondary education is confidential
- 4 and excepted from disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code,
- 5 and may only be released in conformity with the Family Educational
- 6 Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g). The
- 7 Coordinating Board may withhold information prohibited from being
- 8 disclosed under this subsection without requesting a decision from
- 9 the attorney general under Subchapter G, Chapter 552, Government
- 10 <u>Code</u>.
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 61.0511, Education Code, as added by
- 12 this Act, applies beginning with the 2025-2026 academic year.
- SECTION 6. Subsections 28.025 and 28.0257, Education Code,
- 14 as added by this Act, applies beginning with the 2026-2027 academic
- 15 year.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
