5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1701.318 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1701.318. CERTIFICATION REQUIRED FOR PEACE OFFICERS TO
8	CONDUCT POLYGRAPH EXAMINATIONS. (a) The commission by rule may
9	establish minimum requirements for the training, testing, and
10	certification of peace officers to conduct polygraph examinations
11	for the purpose of:
12	(1) a preemployment examination of a candidate
13	applying for a position that requires a license under this chapter;
14	(2) a criminal investigation; or
15	(3) a post-conviction sex offender test.
16	(b) The commission shall adopt rules prohibiting a peace
17	officer from conducting a polygraph examination for a purpose
18	described by Subsection (a) unless the officer:
19	(1) completes a training course approved by the
20	commission; and
21	(2) passes an examination administered by the
22	commission that is designed to test the officer's knowledge of
23	investigative polygraphy.
24	(c) The commission shall issue a certification to conduct

polygraph examinations to a peace officer who applies for the certification, completes the required training, and passes the required examination.
(d) A peace officer holding a certification issued under this section must conduct a test described by Subsection (a)(3) in accordance with guidelines established by the American Polygraph

7 Association, or a successor entity.

8 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 9 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt 10 rules required by Section 1701.318, Occupations Code, as added by 11 this Act.

12 SECTION 3. A peace officer is not required to comply with 13 rules adopted under Section 1701.318, Occupations Code, as added by 14 this Act, until January 1, 2027.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
