## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to tuition and fee exemptions for former foster children
- 3 with intellectual disabilities to attend comprehensive transition
- 4 and postsecondary programs at a public institution of higher
- 5 education.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 54.2002, Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 54.2002. EXEMPTIONS AND WAIVERS FOR STATE-FUNDED
- 10 COURSES ONLY. (a) Notwithstanding any other law and subject to
- 11 Subsection (b), a mandatory or discretionary exemption or waiver
- 12 from the payment of tuition or other fees under this subchapter or
- 13 another provision of this code applies only to courses for which an
- 14 institution of higher education receives formula funding.
- 15 (b) This section does not apply to an exemption for certain
- 16 students from the payment of tuition and fees for a comprehensive
- 17 <u>transition and postsecondary program under Section 54.366</u>(a-1) or
- 18 <u>54.367(a-1)</u>.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 54.366, Education Code, is amended by
- 20 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 21 (a-1) A student described by Subsection (a) who is a student
- 22 with an intellectual disability, as defined by 20 U.S.C. Section
- 23 1140, is exempt from the payment of tuition and fees authorized by
- 24 this chapter for a comprehensive transition and postsecondary

- 1 program, as defined by that section.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 54.367, Education Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 4 (a-1) A student described by Subsection (a) who has an
- 5 <u>intellectual disability</u>, as defined by 20 U.S.C. Section 1140, is
- 6 exempt from the payment of tuition and fees authorized by this
- 7 chapter for a comprehensive transition and postsecondary program,
- 8 as defined by that section.
- 9 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 10 beginning with the 2025-2026 academic year.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
