1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to disclosure under the public information law of certain
1-22 contact information of a notary public that is maintained by the
1-23 secretary of state.

1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Section 552.11765, Government Code, is amended
1-26 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as
1-27 follows:

1-28 (b) Except as provided by Subsections (c), (c-1), and (d),
1-29 information maintained by a governmental body described by Section
1-30 552.003(1)(A)(i) is confidential and excepted from the
1-31 requirements of Section 552.021 if the information:

1-32 (1) is a license application; or

1-33 (2) relates to the home address, home telephone
1-34 number, electronic mail address, social security number, date of
1-35 birth, driver's license number, state identification number,
1-36 passport number, emergency contact information, or payment
1-37 information of:

1-38 (A) an applicant for a license issued by the
1-39 governmental body;

1-40 (B) an individual who holds a license issued by
1-41 the governmental body; or

1-42 (C) an individual who previously held a license
1-43 issued by the governmental body.

1-44 (c-1) Subsection (b) does not prohibit the secretary of
1-45 state from disclosing the home address, home telephone number, or
1-46 electronic mail address of a notary public appointed under
1-47 Subchapter A, Chapter 406.

1-48 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-49 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-50 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-51 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-52 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
