- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Right to Privacy
- 6 Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 2062, Government Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 CHAPTER 2062. RESTRICTIONS ON STATE AGENCY USE AND DISSEMINATION
- 10 OF CERTAIN PERSONAL [INDIVIDUAL-IDENTIFYING] INFORMATION
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 2062.001, Government Code, is amended by
- 12 amending Subdivision (2) and adding Subdivision (3) to read as
- 13 follows:
- 14 (2) "Personal identifying information" includes a
- 15 person's home address, home telephone number, personal cell phone
- 16 number, personal e-mail address, driver's license number,
- 17 emergency contact information, and information that reveals
- 18 whether a person has family members.
- 19 (3) "State agency" means a department, commission,
- 20 board, office, council, authority, or other agency in the
- 21 executive, legislative, or judicial branch of state government,
- 22 including a university system or institution of higher education as
- 23 defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, that is created by the
- 24 constitution or a statute of this state.

- 1 SECTION 4. Chapter 2062, Government Code, is amended by
- 2 adding Section 2062.003 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 2062.003. CONSENT REQUIRED BEFORE DISSEMINATING
- 4 CERTAIN PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION; RECORDS. (a) Except as
- 5 provided by Subsection (b), a state agency may not, without written
- 6 consent, disseminate to any person the personal identifying
- 7 <u>information of a person who submits information to the state agency</u>
- 8 for the purpose of obtaining an occupational license.
- 9 (b) A state agency may disseminate information described by
- 10 Subsection (a) with respect to a person without the person's
- 11 written consent if the dissemination is:
- 12 (1) required or permitted by a federal statute or by
- 13 another law of this state; or
- 14 (2) made by or to a law enforcement agency for a law
- 15 enforcement purpose.
- 16 (c) A state agency shall retain the written consent of a
- 17 person obtained as required under this section in the state
- 18 agency's records.
- 19 (d) For purposes of this section, the term "occupational
- 20 license" does not include a license or permit that is administered
- 21 by the comptroller under the Occupations Code.
- SECTION 5. Section 2062.003, Government Code, as added by
- 23 this Act, applies only to information disseminated or retained by a
- 24 state agency on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 25 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
