A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to health benefit plan coverage for certain biomarker
- 3 testing.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1372.003(a), Insurance Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Subject to Subsection (b), a health benefit plan must
- 8 provide coverage for biomarker testing for the purpose of
- 9 diagnosis, treatment, appropriate management, or ongoing
- 10 monitoring of an enrollee's disease or condition, including an
- 11 enrollee's condition of having received an organ transplant, to
- 12 guide treatment when the test is supported by the following kinds of
- 13 medical and scientific evidence:
- 14 (1) a labeled indication for a test approved or
- 15 cleared by the United States Food and Drug Administration;
- 16 (2) an indicated test for a drug approved by the United
- 17 States Food and Drug Administration;
- 18 (3) a national coverage determination made by the
- 19 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or a local coverage
- 20 determination made by a Medicare administrative contractor;
- 21 (4) nationally recognized clinical practice
- 22 guidelines; or
- 23 (5) consensus statements.
- 24 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act

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- 1 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 2 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 3 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 4 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 5 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to a health benefit plan that is delivered, issued for delivery, or
- 8 renewed on or after January 1, 2026. A health benefit plan
- 9 delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2026,
- 10 is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the
- 11 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for
- 12 that purpose.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
