## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to a study by the Texas Water Development Board of the

- 3 water resources in certain counties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "board" means the Texas
- 6 Water Development Board.
- 7 SECTION 2. STUDY. The board shall conduct a study that
- 8 evaluates and analyzes the water resources in the counties located
- 9 in Regional Water Planning Area M as designated by the board. The
- 10 study must:
- 11 (1) compile and evaluate current data on groundwater
- 12 conditions, including groundwater levels, aquifer characteristics,
- 13 and groundwater use and production;
- 14 (2) fully assess the effects of current and projected
- 15 groundwater production on groundwater conditions;
- 16 (3) establish a framework for analyzing state agency
- 17 data in order to enable policymakers and agency leadership to make
- 18 informed, real-time decisions regarding water resource management,
- 19 financial allocations, and contracting;
- 20 (4) develop predictive models that can be used to
- 21 enhance the allocation of state resources, forecast water supply
- 22 trends, and guide policy decisions that support water
- 23 sustainability;
- 24 (5) identify ways to prevent and mitigate potential

- 1 fraudulent transactions or inefficiencies in financial and
- 2 contractual processes associated with water infrastructure,
- 3 permitting, and management;
- 4 (6) assess the effectiveness of state and federal
- 5 funding mechanisms in addressing water management challenges
- 6 through advanced data analytics;
- 7 (7) review the performance of existing state-funded
- 8 water management and conservation programs in order to determine
- 9 cost-effectiveness, efficiency, and impact; and
- 10 (8) develop standardized, user-friendly reporting
- 11 mechanisms that incorporate clear visual representations and
- 12 interactive tools in order to improve public access to and
- 13 comprehension of water resource data and agency policies.
- 14 SECTION 3. REPORT. (a) Not later than September 1, 2026,
- 15 the board shall complete the study described by Section 2 of this
- 16 Act and prepare and submit a report of the findings to each standing
- 17 committee of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over water
- 18 development.
- 19 (b) The board shall make copies of the report described by
- 20 Subsection (a) of this section available to the public.
- 21 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2027.
- 22 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 23 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 24 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 25 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 26 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
