2	relating to the categorization, collection, and publication of
3	demographic and other information pertaining to certain public
4	benefits programs.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 526, Government Code, as
7	effective April 1, 2025, is amended by adding Sections 526.0011 and
8	526.0012 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 526.0011. COLLECTION OF DEMOGRAPHIC DATA. (a)
10	Subject to Subsection (e) and notwithstanding any other law, if the
11	commission or a health and human services agency collects the
12	demographic data of individuals who receive benefits under a health
13	benefits program administered by the commission or agency, as
14	applicable, the commission or agency, as applicable, shall, wher
15	collecting data relating to the race or ethnic origin of ar
16	individual, provide the individual the option to select or identify
17	appropriate categories and subcategories of race and ethnic origin,
18	including:
19	(1) American Indian or Alaska Native, with a write-in
20	box to state the specific group with which the person identifies,
21	such as Navajo Nation, Blackfeet Tribe of the Blackfeet Indian
22	Reservation of Montana, Native Village of Barrow Inupiat
23	Traditional Government, Nome Eskimo Community, Aztec, Maya, or any

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other subcategory with which the person identifies;

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1	(2) Asian, including the following subcategories:
2	(A) Asian Indian;
3	(B) Chinese;
4	(C) Filipino;
5	(D) Korean;
6	(E) Pakistani;
7	(F) Vietnamese; and
8	(G) other, with a write-in box to state any other
9	Asian subcategory with which the person identifies, such as Hmong,
10	Afghan, or Japanese;
11	(3) Black or African American, including the following
12	subcategories:
13	(A) African American;
14	(B) Ethiopian;
15	(C) Haitian;
16	(D) Jamaican;
17	(E) Nigerian;
18	(F) Somali; and
19	(G) other, with a write-in box to state any other
20	Black or African American subcategory with which the person
21	identifies, such as Trinidadian, Tobagonian, Ghanian, or
22	Congolese;
23	(4) Hispanic or Latino, including the following
24	subcategories:
25	(A) Cuban;
26	(B) Dominican;
27	(C) Guatemalan:

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1	(D) Mexican;
2	(E) Puerto Rican;
3	(F) Salvadoran; and
4	(G) other, with a write-in box to state any other
5	Hispanic or Latino subcategory with which the person identifies,
6	such as Colombian, Honduran, or Spaniard;
7	(5) Middle Eastern or North African, including the
8	<pre>following subcategories:</pre>
9	(A) Egyptian;
10	(B) Iranian;
11	(C) Iraqi;
12	(D) Israeli;
13	(E) Lebanese;
14	(F) Syrian; and
15	(G) other, with a write-in box to state any other
16	Middle Eastern or North African subcategory with which the person
17	identifies, such as Moroccan, Yemeni, or Kurdish;
18	(6) Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, including the
19	<pre>following subcategories:</pre>
20	(A) Chamorro;
21	(B) Fijian;
22	(C) Marshallese;
23	(D) Native Hawaiian;
24	(E) Samoan;
25	(F) Tongan; and
26	(G) other, with a write-in box to state any other
27	Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander subcategory with which the

1	person identifies, such as Chuukese, Palauan, or Tahitian; and
2	(7) White, including the following subcategories:
3	(A) English;
4	(B) German;
5	(C) Irish;
6	(D) Italian;
7	(E) Polish;
8	(F) Scottish; and
9	(G) other, with a write-in box to state any other
10	White subcategory with which the person identifies, such as French,
11	Swedish, or Norwegian.
12	(b) The commission shall ensure that each local entity,
13	including a local governmental entity, responsible for providing
14	demographic data to the commission or a health and human services
15	agency in connection with a public benefits program administered by
16	the commission or agency, as applicable, provides the data in the
17	manner prescribed by this section.
18	(c) In collecting demographic data, the commission and each
19	health and human services agency shall provide individuals from
20	whom the data is sought the option to:
21	(1) select more than one category for race or ethnic
22	origin;
23	(2) select more than one subcategory for race or
24	ethnic origin; and
25	(3) write in a race or ethnic origin not listed.
26	(d) The provision of demographic data under this section by
27	an individual is voluntary.

1	(e) Not later than the first anniversary of the date the
2	federal decennial census is published, the commission shall update
3	the subcategories of race or ethnic origin to include only the
4	subcategories with populations larger than 7,500 as published by
5	the United States Census Bureau, except that each category must
6	include at least the six largest subcategories.
7	(f) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
8	to implement this section.
9	Sec. 526.0012. COLLECTION AND CROSS-TABULATION ANALYSIS OF
10	CERTAIN DATA; PUBLICATION. (a) The commission and each health and
11	human services agency that administers a public benefits program
12	shall collect the following data regarding individuals who receive,
13	or were receiving at the time of the individual's death, benefits
14	under a program:
15	(1) the individual's level of English proficiency; and
16	(2) whether the individual:
17	(A) has a disability;
18	(B) has health benefits coverage;
19	(C) has been diagnosed with a chronic condition,
20	including cancer, obesity, diabetes, or asthma;
21	(D) has access to health care, including
22	preventive care services;
23	(E) has a diagnosed mental health disorder;
24	(F) is or has been pregnant;
25	(G) died as a result of a pregnancy-related
26	cause; and
27	(H) had a child who died as an infant.

- by the commission, a local entity, including a local governmental entity, responsible for providing demographic data to the commission or a health and human services agency in connection with a public benefits program administered by the commission or agency, as applicable, shall report to the commission the data described by Subsection (a) to the extent that data is known or obtainable by the
- 9 (c) The commission shall prepare a cross-tabulation
 10 analysis of the data described by Subsection (a) and the
 11 demographic data collected under Section 526.0011. The analysis
 12 conducted under this subsection must consider subcategories,
 13 including those provided by individuals as a write-in option.

- 14 (d) Subject to Subsection (f) and to the extent permitted by 15 federal law, the commission shall make available to the public on its Internet website in an easy-to-read format metric data obtained 16 17 as the result of the cross-tabulation analysis conducted under this section and organized by the demographic data collected in 18 accordance with Section 526.0011. The metric data published under 19 this section must be organized by category and then by subcategory, 20 including those provided by individuals as a write-in option, as 21 22 applicable.
- (e) The commission shall annually update the metric data published under Subsection (d).
- 25 <u>(f) The storage and communication of data under this section</u>
 26 <u>must comply with existing federal and state privacy laws governing</u>
 27 individually identifiable information. Data made available to the

- 1 public under this section may not identify or allow for the
- 2 identification of individuals.
- 3 (g) This section does not prevent a state agency from
- 4 posting demographic data collected by the agency on the agency's
- 5 Internet website.
- 6 (h) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
- 7 to implement this section.
- 8 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2028:
- 9 (1) the Health and Human Services Commission and each
- 10 health and human services agency to which Sections 526.0011 and
- 11 526.0012, Government Code, as added by this Act, apply shall revise
- 12 the commission's or agency's data collection and reporting
- 13 standards and forms as necessary to comply with those sections; and
- 14 (2) the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 15 publish on its Internet website the metric data required under
- 16 Section 526.0012(d), Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 18 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 19 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 20 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 21 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 22 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
