H.B. No. 5248

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a pilot program for the safe disposal of prescription drugs, including controlled substance prescription drugs. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 442A.001, Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 442A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 7 (1) "Collection receptacle" means a receptacle as 8 described by 21 C.F.R. Section 1317.75 ["Board" means the Texas 9 State Board of Pharmacy]. 10 11 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on 12 Environmental Quality. 13 (3) "Controlled substance" has the meaning assigned by 14 Section 481.002. 15 (4) [(3)] "Pharmacy" means a facility licensed under 16 Chapter 560, Occupations Code. (5) [(4)] "Pilot program" means the prescription drug 17 safe disposal pilot program established under this chapter. 18 (6) [(5)] "Prescription drug" has the meaning 19 assigned by Section 551.003, Occupations Code. 20 21 (7) [(6)] "Ultimate user" has the meaning assigned by 22 21 U.S.C. Section 802. SECTION 2. Section 442A.002, Health and Safety Code, is 23 amended to read as follows: 24

1 Sec. 442A.002. PRESCRIPTION DRUG SAFE DISPOSAL PILOT 2 PROGRAM. The <u>commission</u> [board] by rule shall develop and 3 implement a prescription drug safe disposal pilot program to 4 increase the number of <u>collection receptacles</u> [locations] in this 5 state where unused, unwanted, or expired prescription drugs are 6 collected from the public for safe disposal.

7 SECTION 3. Section 442A.051, Health and Safety Code, is 8 amended to read as follows:

9 Sec. 442A.051. PHARMACY ELIGIBILITY. A pharmacy operating 10 in this state may apply to the <u>commission</u> [board] to participate in 11 the pilot program if the pharmacy:

12 (1) is <u>eligible to register</u> [registered] as an 13 authorized drug collection site with the United States Drug 14 Enforcement Administration; <u>and</u>

15 (2) [is not the subject of state or federal opioid 16 litigation; and

17 [(3)] meets the eligibility requirements established
18 by 21 C.F.R. Section 1317.40 [and board rules].

SECTION 4. Section 442A.052, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 442A.052. APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESSES. (a) 22 The <u>commission</u> [board] shall <u>prescribe</u> [adopt rules prescribing:

23 [(1)] the form and manner for a pharmacy to apply for 24 participation in the pilot program[; and

25 [(2) evaluation and selection criteria and 26 processes].

27 [(b)] The <u>commission</u> [board] shall give priority <u>for</u>

1 participation in the pilot program to a pharmacy applicant that: 2 (1) does not collect unused ultimate user prescription 3 drugs under 21 C.F.R. Part 1317 at the time the applicant submits the application; or 4 5 (2) is located in a rural or underserved area the 6 commission [board] designates. 7 A pharmacy that operates multiple locations may [must] (c) 8 submit <u>one</u> [an] application to apply for the program for all of the locations, provided the application includes information specific 9 to each location, including the physical address, phone number, 10 location name, and pharmacy manager's name [for each location]. 11 12 Each location is separately evaluated for prioritization under 13 Subsection (a). 14 SECTION 5. Section 442A.053(b), Health and Safety Code, is 15 amended to read as follows: (b) Controlled substance prescription drugs, 16 [and] 17 noncontrolled substance prescription drugs, and over-the-counter drugs may be collected together and comingled. 18 SECTION 6. Section 442A.055, Health and Safety Code, 19 is amended to read as follows: 20 Sec. 442A.055. PHARMACY 21 MANAGEMENT; RECORDS. А participating pharmacy is responsible for the daily management and 22 23 recordkeeping of the pharmacy's prescription drug safe disposal program in accordance with the pharmacy's United States Drug 24 Enforcement Administration registration [and board rules]. 25 26 SECTION 7. The heading to Subchapter C, Chapter 442A, 27 Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

H.B. No. 5248 SUBCHAPTER C. <u>COMMISSION</u> [BOARD] DUTIES 1 2 SECTION 8. Section 442A.101, Health and Safety Code, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 Sec. 442A.101. PILOT PROGRAM INCENTIVES. (a) The 5 commission [board] shall assist each pharmacy participating in the pilot program, including by paying [the costs of]: 6 7 the costs of maintaining one collection receptacle (1)8 at each participating pharmacy location and destroying through incineration of the receptacle's full inner liner the prescription 9 10 drugs deposited in the receptacle; and (2) a one-time fee to offset the initial costs of 11 program participation [ordering and distributing pre-addressed, 12 return postage paid mail-back envelopes from a third-party 13 mail-back program and destroying through incineration the returned 14 15 mail-back envelopes containing the collected prescription drugs; 16 and 17 [(3) other operational needs the board determines 18 appropriate]. The commission may contract with a United States Drug 19 (b) Enforcement Administration reverse distributor to install the 20 collection receptacles at participating pharmacy locations and to 21 treat at an incineration facility registered with the United States 22 Drug Enforcement Administration the waste collected through the 23 24 receptacles [board: [(1) shall directly reimburse 25 a participating 26 pharmacy for costs the pharmacy incurs under Subsection (a); and 27 [(2) may not reimburse a participating pharmacy for

the cost of using a third-party incineration facility unless the 1 facility is appropriately registered with the United States Drug 2 Enforcement Administration]. 3 4 (c) [Subject to money available for purposes of this 5 chapter, the board may provide financial incentives to a pharmacy to continue providing prescription drug collection services or 6 expand those services to accommodate controlled substance 7 8 prescriptions.] The commission [board] may provide financial incentives to a chain retail pharmacy for not more than 15 9 locations. 10 SECTION 9. Section 442A.102, Health and Safety Code, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 Sec. 442A.102. COMMUNITY OUTREACH. 13 (a) The commission 14 [board] shall: develop and distribute educational outreach 15 (1) for the public about the availability of 16 materials safe prescription drug disposal in this state; 17 (2) post the materials on the commission's [board's] 18 Internet website; [and] 19 (3) provide the materials to other state agencies, 20 including the Texas State Board of Pharmacy, for those agencies to 21 conduct the community outreach; and 22 (4) create education materials for voluntary use by a 23 24 participating pharmacy. The educational outreach materials must be in English, 25 (b) 26 Spanish, and for specific areas of this state as the commission [board] determines appropriate, another language spoken by a 27

H.B. No. 5248 1 substantial portion of the area's residents. 2 SECTION 10. Section 442A.103, Health and Safety Code, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 Sec. 442A.103. REPORT. Not later than December 1 of each 5 even-numbered year, the commission [board] shall submit to the governor and the legislature a report that: 6 7 (1)summarizes the results of the pilot program, 8 including: 9 (A) the number and geographic distribution of 10 collection receptacles at participating pharmacies; (B) the estimated amount of prescription drugs 11 12 collected by participating pharmacies under the program, measured 13 by: 14 (i) the number of inner liners fully filled 15 with collected prescription drugs and sent for incineration by the 16 pharmacies; and 17 (ii) [the number of mail-back envelopes distributed by the pharmacies; and 18 [(iii)] the weight, measured in pounds, of 19 20 <u>the</u>[+ 21 [(a)] inner liners described by Subparagraph (i)[; and 22 23 [(b) returned mail-back envelopes 24 filled with collected prescription drugs]; the cost of the pilot program; (C) 25 26 (D) [amount of money distributed under the pilot program and] the identity of each participating pharmacy to which 27

1 money is distributed; and

2 (E) [(D)] a description of the <u>commission's</u>
3 [board's] educational efforts and outcomes; and

4 (2) recommends whether the pilot program should
5 continue, be expanded, or terminate or whether the <u>commission</u>
6 [board] should permanently implement a prescription drug safe
7 disposal program.

8 SECTION 11. Section 442A.151, Health and Safety Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 442A.151. FUNDING. (a) Money contained in the opioid abatement account established under Section 403.505, Government Code[, as added by Chapter 781 (S.B. 1827), Acts of the 87th <u>Legislature, Regular Session, 2021</u>], <u>shall</u> [may] be appropriated to the <u>commission</u> [board] to fund the pilot program established under this chapter.

16 (b) The <u>commission</u> [board] may collect gifts, grants, and 17 donations to fund the program.

18 SECTION 12. Section 442A.056, Health and Safety Code, is 19 repealed.

20 SECTION 13. As soon as practicable after the effective date 21 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall 22 implement the prescription drug safe disposal program developed 23 under Chapter 442A, Health and Safety Code, as required by this Act. 24 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
