A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to mental health first aid training for certain school
- 3 district volunteers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 22.904(a), (b), and (c), Education
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, a school
- 8 district shall require each district employee or volunteer who
- 9 regularly interacts with students enrolled at the district to
- 10 complete an evidence-based mental health training program designed
- 11 to provide instruction to participants regarding the recognition
- 12 and support of children and youth who experience a mental health or
- 13 substance use issue that may pose a threat to school safety.
- 14 (b) A school district may not require a district employee or
- 15 volunteer who has previously completed mental health training
- 16 offered by a local mental health authority under Section 1001.203,
- 17 Health and Safety Code, to complete the training required by this
- 18 section.
- 19 (c) From funds appropriated for the purpose, the agency
- 20 shall provide an allotment to each school district to assist the
- 21 district in complying with this section. The amount of an allotment
- 22 provided to a school district under this subsection may not exceed
- 23 the costs incurred by the district for employees' or volunteers'
- 24 travel, training fees, and compensation for the time spent

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- 1 completing the training required by this section. The agency may
- 2 proportionally reduce each district's allotment if the amount
- 3 appropriated is insufficient to pay for all costs incurred by
- 4 districts under this subsection.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 1001.203(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) To the extent money is appropriated for the purpose, the
- 8 commission shall make grants to local mental health authorities or
- 9 local behavioral health authorities to provide at no cost an
- 10 approved mental health first aid training program administered by
- 11 mental health first aid trainers to the following individuals at
- 12 the discretion of the authorities:
- 13 (1) school district employees and school resource
- 14 officers;
- 15 (2) employees of:
- 16 (A) an institution of higher education;
- 17 (B) an open-enrollment charter school; or
- 18 (C) a private school;
- 19 (3) employees and contractors of a child-care
- 20 facility;
- 21 (4) youth;
- 22 (5) individuals with direct and recurring contact with
- 23 students, including school district volunteers;
- 24 (6) first responders;
- 25 (7) military service members, veterans, or immediate
- 26 family members of military service members or veterans;
- 27 (8) judges and attorneys, as applicable based on the

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- 1 practice of law of the judge or attorney; or
- 2 (9) contractors of an institution of higher education,
- 3 an open-enrollment charter school, a private school, or a school
- 4 district.
- 5 SECTION 3. Not later than September 1, 2026, each school
- 6 district shall ensure that each district volunteer described by
- 7 Section 22.904, Education Code, as amended by this Act, has
- 8 completed an evidence-based mental health first aid training
- 9 program as required by that section.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
